PREFACE

The North East Region became barren territory for the Liberal Party as early as the 1920s and remained so, except for a handful of constituencies where the party commanded vestigial support, until the final years of the C20th. Many constituencies were left unfought for decades, possibly a greater percentage than in any other region of Britain. Hence the following pages contain fewer names compared with the Indices for other regions. Few of the candidates listed ever contested constituencies in other regions hence the amount of cross-checking required has been minimal.

The North East has sent only three Liberal/Liberal Democratic MPs to Westminster over the past 70 years yet it has produced a number of major party personalities, colourful characters, eccentrics and the occasional dubious mayerick.

The constituencies which comprise the North East Region at the present time are, for the purposes of this Index, deemed to have been included in the North East Region since 1945, regardless of local government and county boundary changes which have taken place since then.

As is the case with almost every region of Britain, biographical details of SDP candidates have been difficult to locate. Only nine of the 25 SDP candidates listed here fought more than one of the two parliamentary elections, 1983 or 1987. With two notable exceptions, none of them appears to have left a mark on any field of human endeavour. They appear to have been plucked from nowhere and soon returned to obscurity. Nevertheless they all polled respectably in 1983-87 often in the most unpromising constituencies, establishing a useful foundation for candidates of the merged parties in subsequent parliamentary elections.

There is a distinct possibility that the final number of constituencies fought in the Region at the General Election of 1950 increased at the last minute under the so-called Martell Plan, which is explained below.

THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing throughout the regional directories was the electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It was named after Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who advocated the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted less than two months before nomination day, many at the eleventh hour, Martell's objective being to increase the Liberal challenge to a level at which the party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected.

Martell and his supporters, among them many younger party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qqv, believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate. The majority of the constituencies involved were in urban areas of Greater London, the North West, South East, Scotland and the West Midland Regions, though other regions were involved to lesser degree. Quixotically, a considerable number of largely rural constituencies went uncontested where a Liberal candidate might have fared reasonably well, judging upon results obtained at the 1945 General Election. The final national tally of candidates, a fair proportion of them of dubious Liberal pedigree, was over 450. The party lost over 300 deposits, though without contemporary records of Liberal associations, or regional parties, covering the period, it is now impossible to differentiate technically between a 'Martell Plan Candidate' and a candidate, albeit in an unpromising constituency, adopted following more formal procedures, well in advance of nomination day. An enormous percentage of the Martell Plan candidates were among those to lose their deposits of £150, then set at 12 1/2% of votes cast. Fortunately provision had been made for some measure of insurance cover with Lloyds in the City of London against this contingency.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was finally achieved appropriately under the leadership of Jeremy Thorpe at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the following election of 1979. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every successive general election. In recent times party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the party's parliamentary candidates' committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

The scale of defeat for the Liberal Party in the 1950 General Election, in which nine Liberal MPs were elected, was eclipsed by the debacle of 2015 when only eight of the previously held 57 constituencies returned a Liberal Democrat MP. No less than 340 of 631 deposits were forfeited, £170,000, at the current rate of £500, with the threshold at 5% of votes cast. No deposits had been lost by the party at the General Election of 2010. The party went on to lose 375 deposits, totaling

£187,500, at the General Election of 2017 again having fought virtually every constituency on the UK mainland.

BEVERIDGE, Sir William, later Lord, b 1879, Rangpur, India (now in Bangladesh) ed Charterhouse s, Oxford U; initially a lawyer, he became interested in social matters; friend of the Webbs; he served under Winston Churchill at the Board of Trade during Asquith government, becoming particularly involved with the newly-established Labour Exchanges; dir of LSE 1919-37, Master of University College, Oxford from 1937; he published several academic studies in economic matters and social insurance which became very influential; from 1940 he became a temporary civil servant under Ernest Bevin at the Ministry of Labour; later appointed by Arthur Greenwood to chair a highpowered committee to consider the future structure of post-war Britain; from this came the report officially titled Insurance and Allied Services (1942) known to history as The Beveridge Report; he followed up with Full Employment in a Free Society (1944), full employment to be defined as an unemployment rate not exceeding 3%; it embodied many of Keynes's ideas; the impetus behind his thinking was social justice; he identified five evils to be combatted - squalor, ignorance, want, idleness, disease; the tumultuous reception of the report and the glare of publicity it generated in a nation at war, transformed Beveridge, the shy academic, into a national hero; always inclined towards the Liberals, he was prevailed upon to accept nomination for the by-e by Lady Glen Coats and Lady Violet Bonham-Carter qqv; his entry into politics, disapproved of by his college, resulted in him losing his Oxford post; he was long associated with the Eugenics Society which advocated sometimes controversial policies eg encouraging higher birth rate among the middle classes with a commensurate directive aimed at restraint by the working classes; the Beveridge Report became the blue print for the post-war welfare State established by the Labour government under Clement Attlee 1945-51; had a reputation among his critics for conceitedness; Churchill considered him a bore; Left-leaning historians and writers, incl Harold Wilson, a former colleague and later Prime Minister, have played down his role, insisting that he was merely chairman of a committee producing the report, rather than its author; Conservative critics see him as an archetypal socialist

ushering in the decline of society and the self-sufficient individual; his brief career in the Commons ended before the parliament in which the legislation for the social programmes he had advocated were debated and enacted; author *Why I Am A Liberal* (Penguin Special 1945); **Berwick upon-Tweed by-e 1944, 1945; MP 1944-45**; the news of his defeat was greeted with thunderous cheers when it was announced at a conference of the British Medical Association, a body which was opposed to the principles of a National Health Service; raised to Peerage 1946; served as party ldr in Lords; d 1965; see *Dictionary of National Biography, Dictionary of Liberal Biography*
