PREFACE

The North West was a barren region for the Liberal/Liberal Democratic Party for decades from the 1920s with a higher than average number of constituencies left unfought in many cases. After a brief revival in 1950, in common with most regions in the UK, when the party widened the front considerably, there ensued a further bleak period until the 1970s. In 1983-87, as with other regions, approximately half the constituencies were fought by the SDP as partners in the Alliance.

30 or more candidates listed have fought elections in constituencies in other regions, one in as many as five. Cross-checking of these individuals has taken time but otherwise the compilation of this regional Index has been relatively straight forward compared with others. Special note has been made of the commendable achievements of 'pioneer' candidates who courageously carried the fight into the vast swathe of Labour-held constituencies across the industrial zone of the region beginning in the 1970s. The North West Region has produced its fair share of personalities who have flourished in fields outside parliamentary politics. Particularly notable are the candidates, some of whom were briefly MPs, whose long careers began just after World War I and who remained active as candidates until after World War II.

I am greatly indebted to Michael Braham, solicitor, currently Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Merseyside, who has forwarded much invaluable information on North West Region personalities has been incorporated into this directory. Long associated with the Southport LDA, he is the author of a comprehensive history of the Liberal/Liberal Democratic party in that town, covering the period 1885-1995. There are few constituency parties anywhere in the country which have had such an impact upon their region in terms of parliamentary candidates, regional officers or distinguished personalities in public life.

(Note; there were four two-member constituencies in Lancashire, and one in Cheshire, at the 1945 General Election, denoted 'n' after the date. At one of these constituencies, Preston, the Liberals nominated a single candidate.)

There were two by-elections, designated (i), (ii) at Bootle in 1990, caused by the untimely death, within a very short time span, of the sitting Labour MPs.

THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing throughout the regional directories was the electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It was first named after Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who advocated the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted less than two months before nomination day, many at the eleventh hour, Martell's objective being to increase the Liberal challenge to a level at which the party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected.

Martell and his supporters, among them many younger party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qqv, believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate. The majority of the constituencies involved were in urban areas of Greater London, the North West, South East, Scotland and the West Midland Regions, though other regions were involved to lesser degree. Quixotically, a considerable number of largely rural constituencies went uncontested where a Liberal candidate might have fared reasonably well, judging upon results obtained at the 1945 General Election. The final national tally of candidates, a fair proportion of them of dubious Liberal pedigree, was over 450. The party lost over 300 deposits, though without contemporary records of Liberal associations, or regional parties, covering the period, it is now impossible to differentiate technically between a 'Martell Plan Candidate' and a candidate, albeit in an unpromising constituency, adopted following more formal procedures, well in advance of nomination day. An enormous percentage of the Martell Plan candidates were among those to lose their deposits of £150, then set at 12 1/2% of votes cast. Fortunately provision had been made for some measure of insurance cover with Lloyds in the City of London against this contingency.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was finally achieved 25 years later under the leadership of Jeremy Thorpe at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the following election of 1979. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every successive general election. In recent times party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the party's parliamentary candidates' committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

The scale of defeat for the Liberal Party in the 1950 General Election, in which nine Liberal MPs were elected, was eclipsed by the debacle of 2015 when only eight of the previously held 57 constituencies returned a Liberal Democrat MP. No less than 340 of 631 deposits were forfeited, £170,000, at the current rate of £500, with the threshold at 5% of votes cast. No deposits had been lost by the party at the General Election of 2010. In 2017 the party forfeited 375 deposits, totaling

 \pm 187,500 in the General Election held in July that year. The party had contested again contested virtually every constituency on mainland of the UK.

One of the most respected media figures of his day. He campaigned relentlessly for many victims of miscarriages of justice over the years. His voice adapted very well to the public platform, where he proved to be a powerful and persuasive speaker. He wrote a long list of acclaimed books on crimes and trials. His wife of 56 years, Moira Shearer, the ballet dancer and film actress, rendered him enthusiastic support in his

campaigns. Perhaps his best-known book is *10 Rillington Place* (pub 1960) which led eventually to the posthumous pardon for Timothy Evans, unjustly hanged for the murder of his wife and child. The crime had been committed by the serial murderer, John Christie, who was later hanged. The revelations in the book were a major contribution to the campaign for the abolition of capital punishment in the UK. He became a fearless opponent of Britain's adversarial system of justice, calling for its replacement by an inquisitorial system though he never formulated his ideas in a full-length study. His ideas on this subject permeate *36 Murders and Two Immoral Earnings* pub 2003, which includes studies of the cases of Dereck Bentley and the Birmingham Six. Increasingly he questioned whether the police were worthy of the traditional trust of the public, casting doubts upon the integrity of officers of all ranks in many cases involving injustice. His *Trial of Stephen Ward* pub 1964 is a devastating indictment of the corruption of the judiciary and its manipulation by political interests.

Though generally a low key interviewer and presenter, he was adept at making pertinent, dramatic interventions in TV discussion programmes. For example when the career of a recently deceased, errant Conservative MP (a distant relative of Kennedy) and his intimacy with notorious criminal gang leaders was being discussed, Kennedy added "and he was also a shit of the highest order." Kennedy's relationship with the party was sporadic, interrupted at one stage by his joining the Scottish Nationalists platform. After a long absence, he re-appeared in 1988-89 to support the motion at the Blackpool special Assembly calling for the merger of the Liberals and the SDP. He again resigned from the party to contest Devizes in 2001 as an independent, advocating the legalising of voluntary euthanasia. He subsequently re-joined the party. An atheist, latterly mbr of the British Humanist Association he strongly opposed attempts by Catholics in the party who sought to revise the Termination of Pregnancies Act. His crusading liberalism made him many powerful enemies in the Establishment. He was knighted for his services to journalism on the recommendation of Prime Minister John Major, after his nomination, years before, had been vetoed by Margaret Thatcher. In hindsight, it is likely his independent mind and spirit would have precluded him from accepting the discipline required of an MP and loyal member of the party in Parliament, had he been elected; he was a cousin of the now discredited Conservative MP and Broadcaster, the late Sir Robert, later Lord, Boothby who he despised; d Salisbury 2009; Rochdale by-e 1958, 1959

Smith's victory at the by-election in 1972 was a great tonic for the party, still reeling after the setbacks of 1970, and helped quicken the momentum leading up to the General Election of February 1974. Of immense presence, weighing nearly 30 stones, largely due it was claimed in his defence to life-long glandular problems rather than over-eating, he became an immediately recognisable public figure, his bluff, no-nonsense plain-speaking Lancashire voice and good humour, soon endearing him to a wide following through frequent media appearances. His positive appeal to working-class voters was instrumental in re-establishing a Liberal presence in industrial constituencies in the North. His life-long weight problems were due to glandular disorders, not a prodigious appetite. He became a sitting target for cartoonists, satirists, radio/TV comedians. Endless distasteful comments over the years about his size apparently caused him little concern. He was appointed Chief Whip in the Commons by Jeremy Thorpe. He showed himself wanting in the role in times of crisis and was sacked while in hospital, by Thorpe, at the outset of the scandal which led to the latter's resignation as leader in 1976. He defied the party line on a number of issues including opposing the Termination of Pregnancies Act and voicing support for the retention of capital punishment. He was opposed to the merger with the SDP in 1988 contending that the party would have fared better had it not taken place. He retired from the Commons in 1992 and was succeeded by Liz Lynne qv. The fact that he was not granted a Life Peerage at this stage has taken on a sinister significance in the light of subsequent events and revelations.

There had been suspicions during his life time of his alleged physical and sexual abuse over many years of youths in care homes and detention centres in his aegis which apparently were not seriously investigated by the police and/or officially covered up. Shortly after his death details of the extent of his iniquitous misconduct became widely known, leaving an indelible stain on his memory. In 2008 it was also disclosed that he had made public statements claiming that the asbestos firm, Turner and Newall, in his constituency, presented no danger to the public or the environment, contrary to the evidence. It was revealed later he was a shareholder in the firm; Rochdale MBC from 1952, mayor 1966-67; d 2010; subject of book by a subsequent Labour MP for Rochdale, Simon Danczuk who in turn proved to have a dubious past; **Rochdale 1970, by-e 1972, 1974 Feb, Oct, 1979, 1983, 1987, MP 1972-92**; see *Dictionary of Liberal Biography*

JENKINS, Roy Harris, later Lord, b 1920 Abersychan, Monmouthshire, ed Abersychan g s, Oxford U; son of a former miner, (later Pres of South West Miners Fed and Labour MP); service WW II; one of the few real statesmen to have emerged on the parliamentary scene since WW II; though never Prime Minister, or leader of a major party, he was a parliamentarian of the highest order for over 30 years, holding several great offices of state and Presidency of the European Commission; youngest MP when first elected; not an outstanding debater in his early years at Westminster; though when appointed to government office he swiftly became a master at the despatch box, exercising an ascendancy over the House scarcely known since Gladstone and Stafford Cripps; 1964 Minister of Aviation, Home secretary 1965-67, 1974-76 during which he undertook sweeping internal reforms incl police re-organisation and important legal reforms; Chancellor of the exchequer 1967-70 when he pursued a tight fiscal policy aimed at keeping Britain's trade balance in the black; professed to be a Keynesian in outlook; defeated in successive ballots for the party leadership, served as dpty leader 1970-72 but resigned over opposition to his pro-European stance; became increasingly uncomfortable at Labour's steady leftward drift and adhesion to policies he saw as outdated; critics

claimed he was unsuited to the politics of class, ideology etc; that his beliefs were rooted in the Edwardian politics which he admired and wrote about; nevertheless widely respected across party lines; long a friend of Jo Grimond, David steel et alia; the Labour rank and file detested him as an academic bore; right wing critics saw him as a disruptive liberal reformer at odds with traditional moral social values eg reform of theatre censorship, abolition of capital punishment, legalising homosexual practices etc and thus an architect of the permissive society; for his pro-European views he was vilified as unpatriotic from left and right; increasingly disillusioned by the leftward drift of Labour he resigned from the Commons in 1977 to become Pres of the European Commission until 1981; after his return he used the Dimbleby Lectures as his platform for an appeal to the radical centre to change the mould of British politics causing a sensation in the media and parliament; a mbr of 'the gang of four' who left Labour to found the SDP in 1981; re-entered parliament on second attempt at by-election 1982; party ldr 1982-1983; became alarmed at his successor David Owen's rightward drift; lost seat 1987; Life Peerage 1987; elected Chancellor of Oxford U 1987; throughout his career he was a regular radio/TC broadcaster; in later years he was pilloried in the press for a lifelong minor speech defect which his enemies claimed was evidence of a drink problem; ldr of Liberal Democrat peers 1987-97; author of nearly 40 highly praised political histories and biographies, including Sir Charles Dilke 1958, Asquith 1964, Gladstone 1995, Winston Churchill 2001, partautobiography 1991 Life At the Centre; ironically the Jenkins legacy, the product of his efforts post 1981, was to pull down the curtain on old Labour which would never have regained office thus paving the way for the 'New Labour' of Tony Blair which won three successive general elections 1997-2005; d 2003; for Labour he contested Solihull (West Midland Region) 1945, Southwark by-e (Greater London) 1948, MP 1948-50, Birmingham, Stechford (West Midland Region) 1950, 1951, 1955, 1959, 1964, 1966, 1970, 1974 Feb, Oct, MP 1950-76, Warrington by-e 1981, Glasgow, Hillhead (Scotland) 1982, 1983, 1987 MP 1982-87; see Dictionary of Liberal Biography

WILLIAMS, Mrs Shirley Vivian Teresa Brittain, later Baroness Williams b 1930, Chester, nee Catlin; daughter of political scientist, philosopher Sir George C., and distinguished authoress, Vera Brittain; ed at various schools incl Talbot Heath, Bournemouth, St Paul's g s, London and in Minnesota for three years during the war-time evacuation; Oxford U, chair Labour Club, Fulbright Scholar to Columbia U; began career as journalist with The Daily Mirror and Financial Times; gen sec Fabian Soc; contested for Labour Southampton, Test 1959, Hitchin 1964, 1966, 1970 1974 Feb, Oct, 1979 MP 1964-79; in Commons, Shadow Home Secretary 1971-73, 1974 Sec of State Prices and Consumer Protection; 1976 Sec of State for Education piloting through controversial legislation for comprehensive education and abolishing many grammar schools, selective education against bitter opposition; after losing her seat became regular broadcaster radio/TV on discussion programmes Question Time etc; 1988-2001 Prof at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government; one of the original 'Gang of Four' who left Labour to form the SDP; a highly regarded figure, once seen widely as a possible first Labour Prime Minister; greatly respected and loved throughout her career with Liberal Democrats; 1993 Life Peerage; ldr Lib Dems in Lords 2001-04, remaining influential in party and still a familiar figure in the media, she campaigned during 2015 General Election; announced intention to retire from House of Lords, Jan 2016; authoress of several books incl autobiography; Crosby by-e 1981, 1983; Cambridge (East of England Region) 1987, MP 1981-1983; see Dictionary of Liberal Biography

Extreme difficulty has been experienced in tracking down details of the biographies of SDP candidates. With notable exceptions, the majority appear to have made no impression anywhere in public life or indeed in any field of human endeavour, though research will continue. As commentators noted at the time most of them were anonymous individuals, plucked from obscurity. Apart from those few who continued their political activities with the merged parties after 1988, most of them returned to oblivion.
