### **PREFACE**

As a party member since 1959, based in the West Midlands and a parliamentary candidate and member of the WMLF/WMRP Executive for much of that time, I have been in the privileged position of having met on several occasions, known well and/or worked closely with a significant number of the individuals whose names appear in the Index which follows. Whenever my memory has failed me I have drawn on the recollections of others or sought information from extant records. Seven decades have passed since the General Election of 1945 and there are few people now living with personal recollections of candidates who fought so long ago. I have drawn heavily upon recollections of conversations with older Liberal personalities in the West Midland Region who I knew in my early days with the party. I was conscious when I began work, twenty years ago, that much of this information would be lost forever were it not committed promptly to print.

The Liberal challenge was weak in the West Midland Region over the period 1945 to 1959 in common with most regions of Britain. The number of constituencies fought fluctuated wildly; 1945, 21; 1950, 31; 1951, 3; 1955 4. The number of parliamentary constituencies in the region averaged just short of 60, a very large proportion urban in character. Over 1951-55 only one Birmingham constituency was fought, virtually none in the adjoining Black Country conurbation. There was an encouraging increase in the number fought in 1959, 1964 and 1966. There were few by-elections over the post-war period, the Liberals always standing aside until Frank Owen fought Hereford in 1956. The record at by-elections improved dramatically from 1960 but occasional by-elections in the region went unfought until the 1970s. The front narrowed again in the General Election of 1970.

After a record showing in February 1974, the party fought every constituency in the region for the first time at the General Election in the following October. The front narrowed in 1979 when an electoral set back was anticipated after the Thorpe affair and the controversial Lib-Lab agreement of 1977-78. In 1983 and 1987 the Liberal Party and the SDP fought all the constituencies on a shared basis. Since the merger of 1988 the Liberal Democrats have contested virtually every constituency in the West Midland Region at by-elections and at the General Elections of 1992-2015 - the exceptions being West Bromwich West in 1992, the Speaker's constituency, where the Conservatives also stood down, and Wyre Forest in 2001 and 2005, where the party declined to oppose the Independent, Richard Taylor, who represented that constituency 2001-10 under the designation Health Concern, closely associating himself with the Liberal Democrat Parliamentary party and many of its policies in the Commons.

### THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing throughout the regional directories was the electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It was first named after Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who advocated the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted less than two months before nomination day, many at the eleventh hour, Martell's objective being to increase the Liberal challenge to a level at which the party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected.

Martell and his supporters, among them many younger party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qqv, believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate. The majority of the constituencies involved were in urban areas of Greater London, the North West, South East, Scotland and the West Midland Regions, though other regions were involved to lesser degree. Quixotically, a considerable number of largely rural constituencies went uncontested where a Liberal candidate might have fared reasonably well, judging upon results obtained at the 1945 General Election. The final national tally of candidates, a fair proportion of them of dubious Liberal pedigree, was over 450. The party lost over 300 deposits, though without contemporary records of Liberal associations, or regional parties, covering the period, it is now impossible to differentiate technically between a 'Martell Plan Candidate' and a candidate, albeit in an unpromising constituency, adopted following more formal procedures, well in advance of nomination day. An enormous percentage of the Martell Plan candidates were among those to lose their deposits of £150, then set at 12 1/2% of votes cast. Fortunately provision had been made for some measure of insurance cover with Lloyds in the City of London against this contingency.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was finally achieved 25 years later under the leadership of Jeremy Thorpe at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the following election of 1979. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every successive general election. In recent times party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the party's parliamentary candidates' committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

The scale of defeat for the Liberal Party in the 1950 General Election, in which nine Liberal MPs were elected, was eclipsed by the debacle of 2015 when only eight of the previously held 57 constituencies returned a Liberal Democrat MP. No less than 340 of 631 deposits were forfeited, £170,000, at the current rate of £500, with the threshold at 5% of votes cast. No deposits had been lost by the party at the General Election of 2010.

ALDRIDGE, John, b 1944 ed Moseley g s; ins broker/cons, later ran canal boat building firm, man of security firm; fought Birmingham MBC elections 1970s to 80s; served on Regional Parliamentary Cands Selection Comm etc; a highly capable election organiser, agent and campaigner; excellent judge of character and motivation; remembered for his incisive debating style, strong opinions, shrewd grasp of electioneering techniques and dry sense of humour; his premature exit, for business reasons, from political activities in the late 1980s, when the party was making its long-awaited break-through in Birmingham, was widely regretted; one time Treasurer, Birmingham Regional Party; Birmingham, Yardley 1974 Feb, Oct, Aldridge-Brownhills 1979

ALI, Dr Zulfiqar, b 1964, Kashmir, of Muslim background; ed Royal Coll of Physicians, Ireland MBBS, MRCPI; hospital cons cardiologist; joined party 2006; Stoke DC, dpty grp ldr; strong defender of NHS; supports calls for vastly increased provision for mental health care; lives Tunstall, Stoke; **Stoke-on-Trent South 2010, Stoke-on-Trent Central 2015** 

ALLANACH, Richard, of Scottish ancestry; Southampton MBC 1983; later local activist in Rugby, fighting local elections; campaigned for Better Together in Aberdeenshire during the Scottish Referendum; interested in defence matters; regular contributor Lib Dem Voice; **Rugby 2005**.

ANDERSON, M/s Iona, b Leamington Spa; long assn with Coventry; of Afro-Caribbean

background; ed Tile Hill Co; worked for Royal Mail for 20 years, later ran her own internet business advice website; **Coventry North West 2005.** 

ANDERSON, M/s Susan (Sue), b 1945 Cheshire; originally teacher in Birmingham; long-serving Birmingham MBC, WMCC, Lord Mayor 1999-2000; busy with council commitments, she could not be prevailed upon to fight further parliamentary elections; represented in turn both an inner and later, outer Birmingham ward; remembered for her energy, sincerity and statuesque bearing; generally regarded as the leading Lib Dem woman campaigner of her era in Birmingham; **Birmingham, Yardley 1979** 

ANDRAS, Peter, b Rumania 1971, ed Bolyai U; degrees in Computer Science, Artificial Intelligence, Neural Networks; lect Newcastle-upon Tyne U, later Prof of Computer Science and Maths, U of Keele; helped launch University spin-off companies in biotechnology; joined party 2000; active with LDAs in Gateshead, Newcastle-upon Tyne, Newcastle-upon-Tyne MBC, cand for local Police Commissioner; sports an impressive beard; Washington & Sunderland West (North East Region) 2010, **Stoke-on-Trent South 2015** 

ARIF, Haseeb, of Muslim background; b/raised Leamington, ed Cubbington C of E p s, North Leamington s, Royal Holloway Coll, London U; a biochemist who has lately taken up medical studies; strong debater; joined party at school; **Warwick & Leamington 2015** 

ARMSTRONG, Anthony, b 1956 ed Salisbury jun h s, London; comp specialist; Coventry LDA Treasurer; **Coventry South East 1992.** 

ASGHAR, Ali, of Muslim background; Nuneaton 2005, Leicester (East Midlands Region) 2010

ASHALL, Michael R., b 1944 ed Tividale comp s, Dudley Coll of T'nology; sales eng; party activist in Redditch; **Birmingham, Northfield 1997, Redditch 2001.**

BARNES, M/s Ann Charlotte; lived locally since she was 16; Shropshire UA; part-owner of small business; local activist; attractive in personality and appearance; **Ludlow 2015** 

BARNETT, Peter, b 1966 ed Keele U; employed in mineral extraction ind; Congleton BC; **Stoke-on-Trent South 1997** 

BARWICK, David, b 1947 ed Caludon Castle s, Coventry, St Peter's Coll, Birmingham; adult education co-ordinator; joined party 1980; Redditch DC 1986-90, Hereford-Worcestershire CC 1993-97, Wychavon DC; Droitwich TC; energetic campaigner remembered for his off-beat sense of humour; interests incl Amnesty Int; strongly supported by his wife Heather, herself a former WMRP officer; now lives Mid Wales; **Worcestershire Mid 1992, 1997.**

BEDDOW, Alan, b 1966 Bromsgrove, ed Wolverley h s, Worcestershire; IBM eng, project man computer ind; fought local elections Warwick/Leamington; joined party 2003; WMRP officer 2006, long-serving Treasurer from 2009, an office to which he has successfully introduced C21<sup>st</sup> technology and business acumen; affable personality; lives Warwick; **Warwick & Leamington 2010, Warwickshire North 2015.** 

BEESLEY, Michael E., CBE b 1924 research associate, later lect Birmingham U; briefly active with party in late 1940s; thought to have been associated with the classical Liberal economists of 'the Birmingham School' with Barbara Lewis and A.A. Sheffield (qqv); subsequently Prof of Business/Economics, London Business School, LSE; wrote on urban transport subjects; early advocate of privatisation, he steadily moved over to a markedly right-wing viewpoint, becoming a proponent of monetarist theories; highly influential in Thatcher Conservative government circles in '80s and '90s; wrote several books; d 1999?; subject of lengthy press obituaries; Birmingham, King's Norton 1950.

BENNION, Dr Phillip, b 1954 Tamworth ed Queen Elizabeth g s, Tamworth, Aberdeen U, Newcastle U; farmer, near Tamworth, Staffordshire; former lect, Shuttleworth Agricultural Coll;

chair Staffs NFU; has served on national agricultural comms; former SDP member; Staffordshire CC 2002-06, Lichfield DC 1999 -; Euro cand 1999, 2004, 2009; energetic WMRP officer, Eurofile; prominent in Lib Int; acted as an adviser on agricultural to party leader Charles Kennedy for eight years; as one of the best-ever of party's Euro candidates in the WM, he was voted into second place on the party list and when Liz Lynne retired in Feb 2012, he succeeded her automatically; soon made a strong impression in the European parliament as an energetic rep of the West Midlands and Britain; spent on average three weeks in every month in Brussels, one in Strasburg; became leader of British Lib Dem group; kept in touch with regional part members through regular newsletter *Europhile*; member of Euro Parliamentary Committee on Employment and Social Affairs; lost his seat in the disastrous anti-Europe swing of May 2014; easy-going personality, highly popular with rank and file party members and widely respected across party lines for his integrity and work on behalf of the West Midlands region; his wife Penny, also a party activist, renders sterling support; Lichfield 1997, 2001, Tamworth 2005, Telford 2010, Birmingham, Hodge Hill 2015.

BICK, Timothy, b 1955 ed Leamington Coll, Oxford U, Pres of Lib Soc; human resources officer, joined party 1974; Warwicks CC from 1981 when he was youngest cllr elected; later moved to Cambridge; Cambridge DC; **Sutton Coldfield 1987**.

BIRCH, John, b 1947 ed Alcester g s, quantity surveyor; local cllr; **Worcestershire South 1974 Feb, Oct** 

BIRD, Derek, b c1931, Burnley, Lancs; ed Queen Mary's Royal g s, Clitheroe, Lancashire; sales and mark dir of electronics co, fought local government elections, Burnley; author of pamphlet on Liberalism; enthusiastic, earnest and plain-speaking; a LPO Party HQ recommendation; **Dudley by-e 1968.** 

BOAD, Mrs Sarah, b 1958 ed Monmouth s, U Coll, Swansea, C Eng, metallurgist; formerly SDP, joined Lib Dems 1988; Lliw Valley BC; Warwick DC from 1987, grp ldr, Warwickshire CC 1994; active with ALDC; has presided over sessions at Lib Dem Assemblies; took part in a memorable TV hustings with Clare Short MP and Edwina Currie MP during the 1992 campaign, she acquitted herself with much credit; serious minded, highly respected for firm grasp of local government management skills; (her husband Alan is a party activist serving on Warwick DC, CC; exec agent to Lorely Burt MP 2015 qv); Warwick & Leamington 1992.

BOURNE, Steven; Wolverhampton North East 2001, Shropshire North 2005.

BOWEN, Anthony, b 1940 ed Bradfield s, Cambridge U; academic; Shropshire CC; **Shrewsbury** 1983.

BOWKER, Ronald James, b 1914? ed Birmingham U, London U; former land agent, later barrister; WW II service in Intelligence; chair Worcestershire Liberal Federation; **Worcester 1945**, **Wednesbury 1950**.

BRAMALL, Chris, b 1942 London, ed Latymer Upper s, Hammersmith, Cambridge U, St Mary's

Coll of Ed; latterly Open U grad; solicitor; for many years worked in professional ethics dept, Law Society; joined party 1992, attracted by its concern for environmental issues; Dudley MBC grp ldr; has deep roots in Brierley Hill area, an ancestor having pioneered historic local chain and anchor industry; tenacious campaigner; sports splendid shock of grey hair; cheery personality; interests incl global warming; father of the following; Halesowen & Stourbridge 1997, 2001, 2005, 2010, 2015

BRAMALL, Jonathan, b 1970? son of the preceding, ed King Edward VI Coll, Dudley, Essex U; chair Dudley Youth Council; activist in Brierley Hill area; Euro cand 2009; **Dudley South 2005**, **2010** 

BRAZIER, Michael, ed Prince Henry's g s, Evesham, Portsmouth Poly; economics teacher; active with NAS; **Coventry South East 1979.** 

BRIGHTON-KNIGHT, Dr Richard; ed Birmingham U, medical practitioner, MA in public health; formerly in NHS hospital, now private sector; advocates town council for Sutton Coldfield; chair party health policy panel; **Birmingham, Selly Oak 2005, Sutton Coldfield 2010, 2015.** 

BROADBENT, M/s Sarah, b 1956 ed Appleton g. s. Warrington, Bristol U; pension fund man; **West Bromwich West 1992.** 

BRODIE, Ian R., b 1946 ed Wellington g s, Essex U; teacher, charity dir; Shrewsbury 1970

BROWN, Dr Arthur, b Leeds, ed London U (MB 1935); service WW II, RAMC; later GP; lived Wolverhampton from 1935; he fought the constituency, greatly altered by recent boundary changes, held by the Liberal MP Sir Geoffrey Mander until 1945; he finished a distant third; **Wolverhampton North East 1950.** 

BROWN, (Brigadier) Sir Ralph Kilner OBE, b Calcutta 1909; ed Kingswood s, Bath, Cambridge U; called to bar 1934; as a YL was a passionate opponent of Appeasement; UK international athlete, missing 1936 Berlin Olympics through injury; distinguished lawyer; Pres Birmingham L O 1946-56, he was an officer of the old Birmingham Liberal Club in Corporation street, near the Law Courts and barristers' chambers for many years which was much frequented by Liberal-inclined members of the legal profession; closed c 1958; 1946 commander of Birmingham Battalion Boys Brigade on the new Kingstanding estate; later QC, High Court Judge; key figure in planning Overlord, the Normandy Invasion, 1943-44; declined Liberal Life Peerage 1970 on the grounds he could earn more pursuing his legal career; author *Top Brass and No Brass* 1991, in which he challenged the prevailing opinion that the USA had won WW II for an effete Britain; d 2003; he received an extended obituary in *The Daily Telegraph*; **Stourbridge** 1945, Oldbury & Halesowen 1950, Buckinghamshire South (South Central Region) 1959, 1964; a personality of whom there is much more to be learned.

DAY, Robin (later Sir Robin) OBE, b Hampstead, London 1923; ed Bembridge s, Isle of Wight, Oxford U; pres of Union; war service; worked in Washington for British Information Service; called to Bar 1952 though apparently never practised; BBC TV 1952-55, joining ITV News 1956; came to fore after interviewing President Nasser in Cairo in 1957 shortly after Suez episode; after his political interlude, he rejoined BBC TV; at various times presenter of *Panorama*, *Question Time*, *General Election Results and Budget Specials etc* on TV, BBC Radio *World At One* etc; knighted 1981; claimed that he was the first to call for the televising of parliamentary proceedings in a Hansard Society paper in 1963; knighted 1981; published two autobiographies *Day By Day* 1975, *Grand Inquisitor* 1989, the latter being of interest for chapters on the parliamentary campaign at Hereford in 1959 and his dealings with local Liberal personalities, for many of whom he had only contempt, including the aging Liberal stalwart, Alderman Farr qv.

A distinguished, influential, political broadcaster, Day introduced the 'hard line', an abrasive, often belligerent dimension to the techniques of interviewing of political figures. He made the most of his unprepossessing appearance by sporting heavy rimmed spectacles and an enormous bow tie. After his unsuccessful attempt to enter Commons at Hereford, where he failed totally to adapt his undoubted talents either to the platform or doorstep, he was at pains to expunge his association with the Liberals from the memory and distance himself from the party. His commitment to Liberalism had in any case never been more than tenuous. In an interview of his old leader, Jo Grimond, in an election broadcast of 1966, he was rude to the point of offensiveness as if he were seizing the opportunity to make a final public vindication of himself for past transgressions.

Day was said to have been of a cantankerous personality, difficult to work with, with few if any real intimate friends, though he had a myriad of superficial acquaintances. He lacked a genuine sense of humour and always wore a stony expression. The exaggerated professional reputation he enjoyed in life has justly received posthumous re-evaluation. He fell short of being Britain's equivalent of Ed Murrow by a considerable margin; d 2000; **Hereford 1959.** 

DENT, Martin OBE, b 1925, grew up in Harlow, Essex; ed Eton, Cambridge U, Oxford U; studied economics; originally Colonial Civil servant, spending many years in Nigeria; later entered lecturing at Keele U 1963, specializing in political studies; in 1990 co-founded movement which

began campaigning for the G8 countries to cancel debts owed by developing countries; from this grew Jubilee 2000, which enjoyed world-wide support; estimated that \$130 billion has since been written off for many of the poorest and most indebted countries; in 2001 shared International Peace Award of the Gandhi Foundation; retired 1990; genial, perceptive assessor of potential Euro candidates for party for brief period; highly popular with students and fellow academics; of deep Christian faith; a noted eccentric; remained unmarried; d June 2014; received monumental obituary in *The Daily Telegraph*; **Stoke-on-Trent Central 1992.** 

DEWSNIP, Walter (Wally), b Stalybridge 1926; grew up in Gloucestershire; ed Army School of Education, West Hill Coll; Ruskin TU s; catering officer; a leading figure in ALTU; Gloucester MBC, chair Quedgeley PC; jolly, likeable character; promoter of angling as a hobby; received award from Irish Tourist Board for encouraging fishing holidays; **The Wrekin 1974 Oct** 

DHONAU, Mary, b 1958 at Reading, ed Headington Coll s, Oxford, Royal Coll of Music; mother of five children; twelve times a victim of River Severn-related flooding by raw sewage; dir and spokesperson, National Flood Forum, for whom she became an experienced and effective media spokesperson; lives Worcester; **Worcester 2005**

(Len), b c1920; service in WW II, RAFVR, evacuated from Dunkirk; later welfare officer RAF Assn, Dudley; garage proprietor; stalwart of now defunct Gladstone Liberal Club, Dudley; LPO Exec 1961-62; where he was appreciably out of his depth; a diminutive, perky Black Country individual with self-important air, somewhat given to exaggeration; pedlar of scare stories; **Kidderminster 1950.** 

EDEN, Leonard, b 1941 ed The Oratory s, Birmingham; airline sales man; fought local elections Birmingham MB; remembered as a smart dresser who organized highly successful fund raisers at his home; d 2005? **Halesowen, 1974 Feb, Oct** 

ELLIOTT, M/s Doreen, b 1932 ed Ashington Girls sec s; charity organiser later personnel man in eng ind; remembered for her strong opinions and fine public speaking voice; one of the ablest women to stand for the party in a West Midlands constituency; on one occasion described Margaret Thatcher as 'that strident bitch;' believed to have migrated to New Zealand in mid 1980s; Lichfield 1974 Feb, Worcester 1974 Oct, 1979.

ELLIOTT, (Lieut-Col) Norman Walter, ed Tettenhall Coll, Birmingham U; army service WW I/II; china manufacturer in Potteries; adopted as PPC in 1942 in anticipation of a war-time by-election which ironically did not take place due to the electoral truce; LPO Council; Newcastle-under-Lyme 1945, Shrewsbury 1950.

EMBREY, Albert Edward, b 1909; service WW II, evacuated from Dunkirk; cost acc; associated with British Legion; a typical Martell Plan cand, nondescript and anonymous, without known prior or subsequent connection with the party; his exiguous vote was one of the very lowest in the UK; **Birmingham, Aston 1950.** 

EVANS, David, b 1947 ed Teignmouth g s, Liverpool U; FE lect; noted for his dogged persistence,

fighting six elections before his 40<sup>th</sup> birthday but none since; Chester MBC; Wallasey (North West Region) 1970, **Oswestry 1974 Feb, Oct, 1979, 1983,** Delyn (Wales) 1987

EVANS, Gwyn, b 1924 ed Cardiff U; electricity supply man; Newcastle-under-Lyme 1979.

EVANS, Dr Jerry, ed Bradford U, Inst of Archaeology; archaeologist, lect and author of books/articles; Birmingham MBC; **Birmingham, Erdington 2005, Birmingham, Hall Green 2010, 2015** 

EXTANCE, Anthony, b 1935 ed Poole g s, Dorset, a county he described as being 'bogged in feudalism,' Cambridge U, Pres Liberal Club; ind training officer; lived Sutton Coldfield, later Lichfield where he fought local elections; founder member, *New Orbits*, an early party 'think tank'; in early 1960s mbr LPO Council which he termed 'a staid, almost reactionary body;' pioneer activist/administrator of new outdoor activity of Orienteering; active with WMLF; though considered by some to have an air of pompous self-importance, he is more widely remembered for his earnestness, firm grasp of the essence of any subject under discussion, as a witty and forceful debater with an engaging, hyperbolic turn of phrase e.g. 'I have always been a fervent Wessex Nationalist,' 'In a world context I would be a socialist,' etc; his early retirement from activity in the West Midlands was a great loss; his wife Dorothy rendered sterling support; later long-serving cllr/chair Bearsted PC, Maidstone, Kent; Lichfield & Tamworth 1964, Bosworth (East Midlands Region 1966.

FALCONER, M/s Jeanie, lives Bishop's Frome, Bromyard; career as snr cons European public affairs, living/working London/Bruussels; now runs vineyard business; advocates extra funding for rural community services; **North Herefordshire 2015** 

FARMER, Neville, b Hampstead, London 1960 ed King Charles I g s, Kidderminster; former steel worker later journalist, broadcaster and long time TV producer, director, writer responsible for many memorable programmes/series and winner of many awards; contributed to numerous publications; joined party 2006, WMRP officer 2011-; multi-talented, with personable manner, a natural communicator, with sense of humour and fine turn of phrase; impressed with his contribution to debate on IT resolution at Birmingham Assembly 2011; **Wyre Forest 2010.** 

FARR, Albert Edward, b c1890s; owner of construction eng co, farmer; long-serving cllr/ ald, Hereford MBC, Mayor 1952-53 Hereford CC until 1960s; resolutely opposed to self-rule for India and Pakistan; had serious differences of opinion with Robin Day qv during election at Hereford 1959; early advocate of Severn Bridge project; became steadily more right-wing in his views after WW II; attempted to mediate in the internecine BLO and WMLF squabbles of the early 1960s d c1965; **Leominster** 1935, **1945**, **Hereford 1950**. Another personality about whom there is much more of interest to discover.

FARRELL, Lionel, b 1933 ed Battersea g s, Exeter U; solicitor; of Jewish background; lived Leamington; first 'serious' cand in Solihull constituency who sowed seeds of a famous victory 40 years later; his agent was John Windmill qv; his early exit from active politics was much

regretted; Solihull 1964.

FAZAL, M/s Nadia, of Muslim background; former Labour supporter, fought Walsall South 2005 for Respect; joined Lib Dems shortly after; contested elections to Walsall MBC from 2008; Walsall North 2010.

FELLOWS, M/s Sarah, sales manager; active in Wolverhampton where she lives; contested MBC elections; **Staffordshire South 2010.** 

FERGUSON, Tony, Newbury DC; Nuneaton 2001, Warley 2005.

FIELD, Russell, b/raised Coventry, ed Wyken Croft, Calendon Castle, De Montfort U; comp scientist; building society administrator; local campaigner interested in recycling, environmental protection; Coventry MBC; Coventry North East 2005, 2010, 2015.

FISHER, Francis, b 1940 ed Brewood g s, Birmingham Coll of T'nology; civil eng; fought Pembroke 1966 for Conservatives; later joined Liberals; a LPO HQ recommendation he was a last minute adoption; coped competently with a local radio election broadcast; a 'fly-by-night' cand only briefly on the scene; **Warley West 1979.** 

FISHER, John, b Glasgow ed Birmingham U; teacher; lives Leek; Staffordshire Moorlands DC for 15 years, sometime grp ldr; **Staffordshire**, **Moorlands 2005**, **Stoke-on-Trent North 2010**.

FITZGERALD, Sydney Arthur, b 1896, professional soldier, service WW I; in WW II commanded Home Guard co; probably a Martell Plan cand; **Birmingham**, **Erdington 1950**.

FLETCHER, David b 1933 ed Derby g s, LSE; ret British Railways exec; key activist in early revival of party fortunes in North Staffordshire; long associated with Newcastle-under-Lyme; originally adopted as PPC for Newcastle-under-Lyme c 1961, he withdrew on the eve of the General Election three years later; concentrated for many years on his career; re-entered active politics three decades later when in his mid-60s; reported to have shown a desultory attitude to campaigning; criticised for being aloof and remote, virtually uncontactable by WMRP officers; Burton-on-Trent 1997, 2001.

FLORIS, Christopher (Kit), b 1926 ed Highgate s, Oxford U; of Jewish background; man of famous Floris perfumery family co; a professional baker, author of books on cake making; made minor impact at Party Assemblies with histrionic interventions in debates; remembered for his enthusiasm, strong voice, integrity, public cake-making demonstrations, sense of humour and his glamorous wife, Valerie; he hoisted the party vote to over 10,000 in his Black Country constituency but to his disappointment, the local party had no heart for entering the fight in 1966; his abrupt departure from political activity shortly after was a great disappointment; Oldbury & Halesowen 1964.

FOGG, Nicholas, b 1941 ed Warwick s, Nottingham U, Oxford U, King's Coll, London, Harvard U; teacher and cons on international affairs projects; Marlborough TC, Wilts, 1981-89, Mayor 1985-86; individualist; founded St George Community Trust for the Homeless; held strong opinions; an early critic of Thorpe leadership who he referred to contemptuously as 'The Bomber' for advocating the dynamiting of the single railway line into Rhodesia during the UDI

episode; now lives Marlborough; author *Stratford-upon-Avon*, *Portrait of a Town* pub 1986, *Hidden Shakespeare* pub 2012, said to be the first biography of the Bard written by a Stratfordian; first adopted for the constituency c1970 he subsequently withdrew, being re-adopted 20 years later; **Stratford-upon-Avon 1992.** 

FORBES, Linda Craig, b 1957 ed Lesmahagow h s, Lanark g s, Glasgow Coll of Nautical Studies, Plymouth U, later Heriot-Watt U 2008-09, U of E London (Centre of Alternative T'nology) MSc 2008; former merchant navy officer/navigator on variety of vessels, later production dir for international firm of educational publishers; joined party 1990s; Editor 'Who's Who in Lib Dems?' (No.5) 2006; lived Leamington, now lives Orkney, an authority on Renewable Energy Development; LD Euro Group Exec. 2006-09; ALDC Exec 2005-08; strong personality, formidable campaigner; Warwick & Leamington 2001, 2005

FORDHAM, Edward (Ed), b 1971 Kingston-upon-Thames; ed Spalding g s, Nottingham U, Pres of Union; entered university admin; active in student politics; joined party 1988; East Mids Reg Exec 1990-93; moving to the West Midlands, Stoke MBC 1998-02, deputy grp ldr; played key role in reviving party organisation in North Staffordshire; left a mixed reputation in the West Midlands circles after his departure, for occasional high-handedness and alleged profligate spending of party funds; Vice-Chair English Council 1998-99; believed to have spent time subsequently on Paddy Ashdown's staff at Yeovil; energetic campaigner on gender issues; entered into a same sex marriage in Sept 2014, the first by a relatively high profile party figure; ambitious, widely regarded as a political 'high flier;' **Stoke-on-Trent Central 1997**, Hampstead & Highgate (Greater London) 2005, 2010.

FOWLER, Robert (Bob), b 1927 ed Dudley g s; lived Dudley; building ind estimator; served as party agent for J.M. Eccles qv at 1950 General Election at Kidderminster; long associated with old Gladstone Liberal Club, Dudley and others in Black Country area; Dudley MBC for some years from 1961; his winning and holding a seat in hitherto impregnable Labour heartland raised hopes of a wider breakthrough; widely respected figure locally; remembered as an affable, unassuming, well-intentioned Black Country character; d 2011; **Dudley 1964.** 

FOX, R., b 1937; archivist; fought local elections; South West Staffordshire 1979.

FRANKENBURG, John Beeching, b 1921 ed Stowe s, Oxford U, Pres U Liberal Club 1947; army service WW II; barrister; chair NLYLs, active with World Assembly of Youth, chair ULS; one of only four cands in West Midland Region 1955; Kensington South (Greater London) 1950, Berwick-upon-Tweed (North East Region) 1951, **Nuneaton 1955**.

FREEMAN, Eric, b 1937 ed Port Glasgow h s, Stockport Tech; a sales manager; an aggressive Clydesider with an aura of menace; **Staffordshire South West 1974 Feb, Cannock 1974 Oct** 

FURNISS, Eric, b 1914 ed Birmingham Coll of T'nology, Ruskin Coll, Oxford; lived Fox Hollies, Birmingham; ind competitions officer; formerly Labour; member of ALTU; staged first public speaking courses in West Midlands for cands c1962; fought local elections in Birmingham; remembered for his morose demeanor and pessimistic outlook; **Stafford & Stone 1964.** 

FURSE, Andrew; Bath & North East Somerset DC, Mayor; Coventry North West 2015

FYSON, Robert, b 1940 ed Christ's Hospital s, Oxford U; FE lect; Newcastle-under-Lyme MBC from 1970, Newcastle-under-Lyme DC from 1973; Newcastle-under-Lyme 1974 Feb, Oct

GADIE, Geoffrey, b 1944; ed Barton g s, Humberside, Sheffield Poly; regional man, British Leyland; mbr BIM; **Solihull 1987.** 

GALLAGHER, James Y. (Jock), b 1938, Greenock, Scotland ed Greenock h s, Stone Coll, Glasgow, Wulfrun Coll, Wolverhampton; National Service Royal Artillery 1956-58; journalist, broadcaster, later senior BBC Radio exec, Pebble Mill, Birmingham; joined YLs 1954; publisher/original editor of 'Who's Who in the Lib Dems?'; prolific author of articles, booklets dealing with BBC programmes including The Archers and media personalities, Laurie Lee, Lady Barnett, Gwen Berryman etc; worked on more than a hundred documentaries; also stage producer; regular columnist in Liberal Democrat News; Sutton Coldfield MBC 1966-69; Euro candidate 1994; lives Bewdley; energetic Regional Campaign Director, General Election 1997; member WMPR Exec; assuming office as President 2010, he revolutionised regional communications, turning the newsletter into an informative, well-produced, well-illustrated (with his own camera shots), punchy, regular publication; long time Chair PCA; highly regarded at LPO HQ where he has been a strong advocate of WMRP interests; adept at low-cost election constituency campaigning; introduced WM Lib Dem 'battle bus'; multi-talented with dry sense of humour; interests include human rights; pub 2014 Great Scots, a commemoration of the achievements throughout the world of men and women of Scottish background; latest innovation Who's Who in the West Midlands? pub 2015 which includes many newly enrolled party members; Birmingham, Edgbaston 1997.

GARDINER, (Major) W. H., b Co Kerry, Ireland, ed Abbey s, Tipperary, Wellington Cadet Coll, India; serving in Indian Army to end of WW II; pedigree pig breeder; lived Rushock, Worcestershire; one of the more bizarre party cands in 1950, left party soon after his single parliamentary contest, adopting extreme right-wing views which he vented in the correspondence columns of the local press; Kidderminster RDC 1960s; Worcester 1950.

GARNER, M/s June, b 1930; sen lect FE; remembered only for informing the media that she did not welcome publicity of any kind occasioned by the exigencies of being a parliamentary candidate; **Burton-on-Trent 1983.** 

GARRETT, Ian, b Greenwich, London 1965 ed Hazlehurst and Sidcup g s, Birmingham U, Oxford U, Pres Liberal Soc; teacher; joined party 1983; CND supporter; fought Birmingham MBC elections; Sandwell MBC; persistent campaigner; interested in young people's issues; Liberal Christian Forum, Amnesty Int, ALDHS; Birmingham, Erdington 1997; West Bromwich East 2001, 2005, 2010, Aldridge-Brownhills 2015

GIBSON, Peter, b 1935 ed Warwick s, Coventry Tech; electronics eng; one-time officer Warwick LA; victim of malicious eve of poll local press headlines claiming he was in arrears with the GPO over his telephone bill; this turned out to be a trivial sum; the attendant publicity probably accounted for the loss of his deposit by a handful of votes; **Warwick & Leamington 1964.** 

GILL, (Air Vice Marshall) William, b 1918 West Hampstead, London, ed University Coll s, Imperial Defence Coll; RAF career 1936-73; WW II flying ace in Burma later in England piloting Mosquitos

in air defence against V1 flying bombs over North Sea, Normandy invasion etc; became senior instructor/lect in Mosquito pilot training; later personnel advisor, P & O, chair Merton Associates (Consultants); a LPO HQ recommendation; made only a token appearance locally; d 2007; Walsall North 1974 Oct

GILLETT, Ian, b 1943 ed Lanchester Poly, Coventry; metallurgist; Solihull MBC, one time grp ldr; Solihull 1979, 1983.

GLENTON, Robert, b 1919; ed Scarborough Coll; international rally driver, motoring correspondent with *Sunday Express* etc and author; an LPO HQ recommendation, he fought the Worcester by-e 1961, finishing a very close third in a tight three cornered contest, a result which re-invigorated the regional party; re-adopted, he subsequently resigned; his abrupt departure from the West Midlands was much regretted; he was ably supported by his accomplished and attractive wife, Stella King 1919-82, a journalist and authoress; d 1998; Hitchin (East of England Region) 1959, **Worcester by-e 1961**, Enfield West (Greater London) 1964, Bolton West (North West Region) 1966

GOLDBLATT, Simon, b 1928 ed Eton, Cambridge U; of Jewish background; barrister, later QC with chambers in Birmingham; later built up practice in London; active with British West Indian Study Circle 2005; not a dominant personality, remembered for his earnest approach; his seemingly irrelevant references to his recent holiday in Yugoslavia during a flagging televised debate at the Brighton Assembly 1963, plunged the proceedings into embarrassing confusion; **Rugby 1959, 1964**, Twickenham (Greater London) 1966.

GONCALVES, Eduardo; charity dir; associated with Kidney Kids, Climate Group; environmentalist; **Rugby 2015** 

GOPSILL, Graham, b 1938 ed Moseley School of Art, lived Castle Vale, Erdington; insurance agent, later antiques dealer; Birmingham MBC from 1969; one of the Liberal 'young lions' who stood up to the leadership of Wallace Lawler qv; Birmingham MDC from 1973; the unfortunate 'fall guy,' disgracefully ill-used at a by-election in 1977 when polling day coincided with Steel's decision to enter a Lib-Lab pact with Callaghan Government; in his final campaign, his elopement on polling day to marry his second wife, gave rise to wide media publicity; later moved to Droitwich, elected to DC, later Mayor; remembered for his resilience, energy, courage, strong speaking voice and strong opinions; d 2009; Birmingham, Stechford 1974 Feb, Oct , by-e 1977, 1979, Birmingham, Hodge Hill 1983.

GRANT, Roger, b 1946 ed King's Hill s, Lichfield; education welfare officer; Aldridge UDC; **Birmingham, Selly Oak, 1974 Feb, Oct** 

GRANT-SMITH, Derek b 1942 ed Slough g s, marketing manager with giant US corporation MMC, later lect in Management at Sandwell Coll, West Bromwich where he was sometime colleague of Brian King, Lionel King qqv; remembered for his commitment, sense of humour and election posters bearing the none-too-imaginative exhortation 'Grant Smith Your Vote'; his abrupt exit from active politics was greatly regretted; **Birmingham, Handsworth 1974 Oct** 

GREEN, Christopher F., b 1943 Cheshire, ed Wrekin Coll, King's Coll, London U; journalist and partner in ind relations co; joined party 1966; remembered for his all-round communication

skills, persistence and commitment; man of many interests; Surbiton (Greater London) 1970, Cheadle (North West Region) 1974 Feb, Oct, **Hereford 1979, 1983, 1987** 

GREEN, Colin, ed Stafford U; software eng; fought on record of party's successes in the coalition; interests incl social housing, apprenticeships; has lived in Selly Oak since 2000; **Birmingham**, **Selly Oak 2015** 

GREEN, John, b 1916 ed Fircroft g s, U of Wales, Aberystwyth; business cons; subsequently found to have had dubious antecedents (unspecified); **Birmingham**, **Hall Green 1966**.

GREEN, Matthew Roger, b 1970 Shrewsbury, ed Priory g s, Shrewsbury, Shrewsbury Sixth Form Coll, Birmingham U; co dir, former restaurateur, hotelier; joined party 1993; South Shropshire DC 1994-; WMRP Exec 1995-2000; Party Fed Exec 2004; possibly first Lib/Lib Dem elected for predominantly rural constituency in West Midlands for over 100 years; his unexpected defeat in 2005 was an enormous personal disappointment and a great set-back for the party; formidable campaigner, determined and committed; not without critics among constituency party members, some of whom saw him as stubborn, arrogant, high-handed and allegedly profligate with campaign expenses; took on WMRP responsibilities for election campaigns and strategy; in Parliament proved to be a high-flyer who was soon appointed party Front Bench spokesman on Youth Affairs in Commons; seems certain to resume Westminster ambitions, though is not currently a PPC; brother of the following; Wolverhampton South West 1997, Ludlow 2001, 2005; MP 2001-2005.

GREEN, Nathaniel (Nat) T., b Broad Oak, Salop 1966 ed Priory b g s, Shrewsbury Sixth Form Coll, Bradford U; varied career, teaching, publishing, finance, journalist with specialist magazines; brother of the preceding; **Telford 1997**; Holborn & St Pancras (Greater London) 2001, Hornchurch (Greater London) 2005

GRENVILLE-JONES, Thomas (also styled T. G. Jones), b 1923 ed Llandridnod Wells, Tonbridge s, Cambridge U; RAF WWII; journalist later political cons with own co from 1960, External Political Services; one-time close associate of former Liberal Leader, Jeremy Thorpe; had flair for self-publicity, and according to his *Guardian* obituarist, 'charm and a saucy wit;' despite his encouraging result at Leominster the LA declined to re-adopt him, his life-style not meeting with the approval of the strait-laced membership and officers; defected to Labour in late 1960s; d 2000; fought Isle of Ely 1950 (East of England Region), **Leominster 1959**, Tavistock (Devon & Cornwall Region) 1964

GRIFFITHS, Ian, raised in Bilston, ed Penn Hall special s, Bilston Community College; trained as cook; volunteer with CAB; disabled; lived for some time in Portsmouth now at Ludlow; **Wolverhampton South East 2015** 

GRIFFITHS, John, b 1934 ed Uppingham s, Cambridge U; journalist, later hair of a squash development co; prominent as NLYL Chair 1961-63; lived London; served on LPO Exec; one the youngest JPs ever to be appointed; caused dissension when declaring in press his support for a Labour candidate, a personal friend, at an important by-election; a waspish individual, remembered for his over confident bearing and abrasive style of electioneering; **Ludlow 1964**, Wanstead & Woodford (Greater London) 1966, Bedford (East of England Region) 1974 Feb

GRIFFITHS, Mrs Olive, b 1919 lived Streetley, Aldridge; former charity worker; life-long Methodist activist; long active with Sutton Coldfield LA later Walsall, Aldridge-Brownhills LDAs and WMRP; prominent in animal welfare on which she contributed to party policy; decidedly less than enthusiastic about SDP connection; frequent local election candidate in Walsall MBC, also agent/organiser/fund raiser, with passion for book fairs and jumble sales; indefatigable campaigner, continuing activities almost to her death; remembered for her pugnacious style of campaigning, irascible temperament and barbed sense of humour; her strident, assertive voice (and occasional fearsome grimaces) struck fear into supporters and opponents alike; d 2004; Birmingham, Perry Barr 1979.

GUPTA, Mihir, b 1935 ed Calcutta U; teacher; of Hindu background, Chairman of Indian Assn. of UK chair Birmingham Advisory Council of Commonwealth Immigrants; courageously attacked and exposed corruption of 'official' Asian community leaders and temple dignitaries; his opponents in the Indian community who were almost exclusively Labour supporters, mounted a vicious campaign against him at the general election, accusing him of being a CIA agent, a covert racist and finally an untouchable; there was also wholesale abuse of the ballot box by impersonation, plural voting etc which the authorities did not take seriously at the time; he polled 2.4%; a close associate of Brian King qv, WMRP chair; remembered as an impulsive, obsessive individual, with grandiose ambitions and for his sometimes outrageous utterances; always involved in controversy; a gift for showmanship, publicity and organisation; his untimely death was a great loss to the Asian community; thought to be first Asian Liberal parliamentary candidate in UK since 1950; d c 1980; **Smethwick 1970.** 

GWINNETT, Malcolm, b 1953; baker; Wolverhampton MBC 1990; Chair Wolverhampton Small Business Club; **Wolverhampton North East 1992.** 

HADLEY, Michael (Mike) Peter, b 1943 Kinver, Staffordshire; ed King Edward VI s, Stourbridge, Aston U; pharmacist, highly successful man dir of computer co; Shrewsbury DC 1994-96, Wyre Forest DC 1980-84, Bewdley TC 1986-90, later Mayor; considered a rising star of the WMRP in the 1990s; affable and hard-working, not remembered as a forceful personality; retired to Channel Isles as tax exile; **Dudley West by-e 1994, Worcestershire West 1997, 2001** 

HAGAN, Sean, b 1963 ed Hayling comp s, Rhyl h s, U Coll of Wales, Aberystwyth, Chester Coll of Law; solicitor; activist with Birmingham, Selly Oak LDA; **Birmingham, Hodge Hill 1992.** 

HAINS, Richard (Dick) b 1945 ed sec s; superintendent children's officer, later principal social worker; his lightning campaigns eg Walsall South were memorable for the prodigious scale of his fly-posting; otherwise left little personal impression; Harrow LBC grp ldr, ldr of opposition; Walsall South 1974 Feb, Birmingham, Northfield 1974 Oct, Ealing South 1979, Harrow East 1983 (both Greater London)

HALL, John C., b 1925 ed King Edward's s, Bruton, Oxford U; writer, FE lect; fought Chippenham (South West Region) 1959, **Worcestershire South 1970**, Angus North (Scotland) 1974 Feb

HALL, Malcolm, b 1947 ed Tinklers Farm s, Northfield, Birmingham Poly, Wolverhampton Poly; lect; Redditch MBC; Redditch 1997.

HAMSHERE, W. P., journalist with renowned Liberal-leaning national daily, *The News Chronicle* (defunct 1960); **Birmingham, Acocks Green 1945.** 

HANLEY, T. P., b 1917?; RAF service WW II; sheet metal worker; possibly first Liberal cand from shop floor in West Midlands; probable Martell Plan cand; **Brierley Hill 1950.** 

HARDEMAN, Kenneth G., b 1936, Aston, Birmingham, ed sec mod s; successively technical publisher's rep, tech education adviser, bingo caller, boxing promoter, restaurateur etc; a leading figure 1950s and 60s in self-build housing movement; Birmingham MBC (for Newtown Ward, as second Liberal cllr from 1966); later represented Rotten Park, ald from 1971; long an associate of late Wallace Lawler qv; in late 1980s joined Conservatives; re-elected to Birmingham MBC; fought as Conservative Birmingham, Sparkbrook 1997, Birmingham, Selly Oak 2001; at the time of his death, prominent as Cabinet member for Regeneration in Con-Lib Coalition in control of Birmingham Council; not always taken seriously during his Liberal career; acquired reputation as a back street Birmingham 'hustler' on a par with Labour's Ald Sir Frank Price; led a complicated personal life; remembered as a smart dresser and for his energy, resilience and strong appeal to female voters; received generous and largely well-merited media tributes for his work for Birmingham; though shrewd and sharp witted, the depth of his thinking was not profound; d 2007; Birmingham, Ladywood 1974 Feb, Oct, by-e 1977, 1979, 1983, Birmingham, Hodge Hill 1987.

HARMER, Roger, b 1965, Cambridge, ed Bristol g s, Oxford U; reg dir for bus communications firm, later man of charity, latterly head of income generation, Garden Organic; joined party 1979; Birmingham MB 1995-2001, 2008 to date; interests incl housing, child poverty; lives Edgbaston; Birmingham, Sparkbrook & Small Heath 1997, Birmingham, Hall Green 2005, Birmingham, Edgbaston 2010.

HARRIES, Dr Hilary L., b 1929 ed Towyn g s, St Bart's, University Coll, London; lect at Birmingham U Med. School; remembered for his gruff manner and fearsome, ursine appearance; in common with Olive Griffiths qv he was discretely advised to omit a photograph of himself from his election address; had lighter side; alleged to have once entertained his students before a lecture by downing a pint and then performing a hand stand; powerful voice, thunderous laugh, somewhat given to making explosive speeches in public; an early devotee of the legendary satirical TV programme 1961-63 *That Was The Week That Was*; sometime WMRP officer for whom he headed a successful emergency financial appeal; Bromsgrove UDC early 1960s; adopted as PPC for Bromsgrove 1960, he worked for four years unstintingly to build up local organisation and a council foothold, then resigned abruptly for family reasons in 1964, shortly before the general election; his early departure from the WM political scene was greatly regretted, when the regional party boasted few real characters; believed to have moved to Dorset; **Worcestershire South 1959.**

HARRISON, M/s Jo (Josephine), b 1952; died tragically after nominations had closed for what would have been her second contest; replaced by M/s Jo Crotty qv; d 30/4/2005; **Staffordshire South 2001.** 

HARROD, Alan, b 1935 ed sec mod s; placement/development officer; Sandwell MBC from 1991; active with TGWU; Warley East 1992.

HARTLEY, M/s Patricia, Halesowen 2001.

HARVEY, Christopher b 1949 ed Kidderminster Coll, Bristol Poly; Chamber of Commerce exec; joined party 1970; Kidderminster/Wyre Forest BC early 1980s; officer of Hereford-Worcestershire Chamber of Commerce; committed Christian; interests incl the economy, Europe; **Halesowen 1979.** 

HASLAM, S. W., service WW I/II; surveyor and valuer; Liberal until 1950; briefly defected to the Conservatives, later rejoining Liberals; typical Martell Plan cand, adopted at last minute; reportedly over-imbibed early on polling day and was taken into police custody; **Birmingham**, **Stechford 1950.** 

HASSALL, Raymond (Ray), b 1943; ed Ontario, Canada; six years military service; later telecomms eng; long campaigning cand Birmingham MB elections; cllr Perry Barr 1990 to date; Cabinet member for Sport and Leisure in Lib-Con coalition admin of city 2006-10; strong proponent of regular Focus deliveries and community involvement philosophy; long-serving, great hearted, hard-working councillor whose enthusiasm for the fight is infectious; lively sense of humour, steadfast in adversity; model of integrity and commitment, a staunch friend and most loyal of colleagues; has a profound interest in the antiquities of Crete where he has spent frequent vacations; Lord mayor Birmingham 2016-17; **Birmingham, Perry Barr 1997.** 

HASWELL, M/s Sue, b 1964 ed King Edward's g s, Bourneville S of Art; media sales man, later with own co; lives Bromsgrove; **Bromsgrove 2005.** 

HAWKINS, Nigel, b 1935 ed Sherbourne s, Cambridge U; solicitor; Nuneaton 1974 Oct

HAYES, Mrs Ada L. M., ed Birmingham U; former teacher; organiser Birmingham Electrical Assn for Women; Pres, Business and Professional Women's Assn, Birmingham; a probable Martell Plan cand albeit one from a professional background who had expertise to offer; **Solihull 1950.** 

HAYNES, Steven, b/raised Birmingham, mainly Northfield area, ed Shenley Court Performing Arts Coll, Birmingham U; interested in directing aid and resources to failing schools; **Birmingham**, **Northfield 2015** 

HEAP, Michael; Wolverhampton MBC, Mayor; Walsall North 2001.

HEMMING, John A. M., b 1960 Birmingham, ed King Edward g s, Birmingham; affluent owner/founder of computer/IT company; made first £1m by age of 23; prominent figure in business world; Birmingham MBC 1990 to date, rose to leadership of Lib-Dem grp and Cabinet member; lives Moseley, Birmingham; persevering, indefatigable cand over many years; soon after election as MP unmasked by press as a serial heterosexual; propensity for conducting his complicated private life in a manner of interest to tabloid press; despite much negative publicity, embarrassing both for himself and the party, mostly concerned with trivial and absurd details, he has a decidedly positive Commons record; acquired reputation for being 'maverick' taking up unfashionable causes; single-minded, 'carry no passengers' approach; redoubtable campaigner in Parliament on children's, parental and adoption issues, latterly opposing muzzling of the media by the granting of High Court injunctions to the wealthy and privileged; chair of the all-party parliamentary group on Peak Oil and gas concerned with fossil oil depletion; member of the Beveridge group; from 2007 party spokesman for the West Midlands; remembered for his valiant but ill-fated attempt to save British Leyland from extinction pledging a contribution from his private fortune; one time drummer in heavy metal group, jazz pianist, mbr Musicians U; his victory at Yardley in 2005 at his fourth attempt was the first for the party in the city since the success of Wallace Lawler qv at Ladywood in 1969 and the first at a parliamentary general election since the 1880s; said to have taken up 30,000 constituents' cases in ten years as MP; Birmingham, Hall Green 1983, Birmingham, Small Heath 1987, Birmingham, Yardley 1992, 1997, 2001, 2005, 2010, 2015; MP 2005-2015

HEMSLEY, Kenneth, b 1926, ed Bridgnorth s, Salop, Kirkby Coll of Ed, Manchester U; ret sen lect FE, Cheshire CC, Congleton MBC, TC; remembered for his easy-going, good-natured affability; a little too bland to make a strong impression in election campaigning; active with NATFHE; Eccles (North West Region) 1983, **Burton-on-Trent 1987**, **Shrewsbury 1992**.

HERRINGSHAW, Gordon ("'Hernshaw,' if you please"), b 1934; ed Bishop Vesey g s, Sutton Coldfield, King Edward VI s, Birmingham, Oxford U (graduate in PPE) co dir; from Conservative background; had meteoric rise to prominence in Liberal circles as a Wallace Lawler qv protege in mid 1960s, the latter arbitrarily securing his nomination for the third seat in Newton ward, against many competing claims from long campaigning party members; Birmingham MBC from 1967 alongside Lawler and Hardeman qv; subsequently returned to Conservative fold; may have fought elections later for that party; hardly taken seriously during his flirtation with the Liberals, he is remembered for his syrupy charm, casual attitude, occasional embarrassing gaffes when speaking in public and his resistible wife; described by both many supporters and opponents as 'a stuffed shirt;' 'a cynical opportunist and chancer;' still active in Birmingham business circles c2007; **Stratford-upon-Avon 1966, Birmingham, Small Heath 1970.** 

HICKS, Nigel Stuart, b 1955 ed Falmouth g s, Trent Poly; cha quantity surveyor; lives Redditch; Warwick & Leamington 1997, Meriden 2001, Redditch 2005.

HILL, R. W. T., b 1917; service WW II; carpet manufacturer, associated with Independent Traders Alliance, National U of Manufacturers; active with party in Kidderminster LA and local Liberal Club; his pride would not allow him to accept an offer of a recount by the returning officer when only a handful of votes short of saving his deposit; **Bromsgrove 1950.** 

HINKS, Mrs Nora F., b c1920s; housewife; later appointed JP, Birmingham, one time chair,

Birmingham Women Liberals; defected to Labour early 1950s; Birmingham MBC early 1960s later crossing floor to rejoin Liberals and old colleague Wallace Lawler qv; one of the most colourful and quintessential Brummie characters of her day with a strident voice and authentic accent to match; the impulse of anyone hearing her speak for the first time was to laugh out loud; her attempts to 'talk posh' were a disaster; took herself very seriously; held strait-laced views on matters sexual; she appeared on TV in a memorable and hilarious confrontation with the female owner of the city's first sex supermarket; a pioneer in calling for a greater role for women in public life; said to have campaigned in 1950 for more generous food rationing with slogans including 'Meat and two veg for all!' probably a Martell Plan candidate; d 1990s; Birmingham, Perry Barr 1950.

HOLDEN, Michael, b 1947 ed Mount St Mary Coll, Manchester Poly; teacher; Leek 1974 Oct

HOLTOM, M/s Ann, b/raised Erdington, Birmingham; ed Sutton Coldfield Coll of FE; various posts in business incl driving school proprietor/instructor; originally elected as Labour cllr for Erdington, Birmingham MBC, crossing floor to join Lib Dems 2006; concerned with youth unemployment; called for end to 'bedroom tax'; lost her council seat in dismal year for party 2014; stalwart local campaigner interested in education; **Birmingham, Erdington 2010, 2015.** 

HOOPER, Edward, b 1940 ed Bryanston s, Leeds U, Harvard U, Oxford U; leather manufacturer/merchant with old family business in Walsall; noted for courteous, unassuming demeanor; fought Walsall South 1974 Oct, Sutton Coldfield 1979

HOPKINS, Glyn, b 1937 ed Pontywalin g s, Gwent; remembered for his bumptious Welsh volubility and self-important attitude; **Dudley East 1974 Oct** 

HORNBY, Mrs Pam, b 1935 ed Wallington City g s, Leeds U; ret teacher, later with National Trust; officer of National Council of Parent-Teacher Assns; Congleton DC, Mayor; **Stafford 1997** 

HOVERS, Kenneth, b 1922; ed King Edward's s, Birmingham; awarded DFC while in RAF in WW II; wholesale greengrocer, a pioneer of pre-packaging, later ins cons; lived Sutton Coldfield; Sutton Coldfield MBC 1957 to early 60s; subsequently active in Birmingham party circles; a suave, business type, remembered for his confident, positive approach and for bravely forging an entry into local government in a previously impregnable Tory stronghold; d c1992; **Sutton Coldfield 1959, Birmingham Perry Barr 1974 Feb, Oct** 

HOWES, M/s Monica, b 1938? ed Haberdashers' Aske's s, Johannesburg h s, S. Africa, Westminster U; dir of international office at Open U; fought Mid Beds (East of England Region) 1983, Ealing, Southall (Greater London)1987, St Albans (East of England Region)1992, Aldridge-Brownhills 2001.

HUFFER, T. Ian, ed Ludlow g s, Oxford U, barrister; Macclesfield MBC 1984-88; contesting Shropshire CC elections 2010; interested in green issues; Denton & Reddish (North West Region) 1987, **Ludlow 1997.** 

HUGILL, David (later Dr), b 1939 ed Adam g s, Birmingham U; research chemist; later industrial chemist; hailed from Hodnet, Salop; former Chair, U Lib Soc, associated with Ad Lib Group; with Brian King, Lionel King, Stuart Stockdale qqv; remembered for his courage, enthusiasm, intellect

and as a forceful speaker; fought bravely in notorious Smethwick campaign amidst highly-publicised, Conservative-incited racial ill-feeling; his early departure from the West Midlands scene was much regretted; later served as officer of an LDA in Essex?; **Smethwick 1964**.

HUMPHREY, Patrick T., b 1926 ed Kingston g s, King's Coll, London U; transport officer; Dagenham (Greater London) 1964, **Birmingham**, **Erdington 1974 Feb** 

HUNT, Jonathan (Jon), b 1958 ed Monkton Combe s, Bath, St Aubyns s, Tiverton, U of Tromso, Norway, Cambridge U; former feature journalist on Health with Birmingham Post 1988-99; later developing interests and responsibilities in transport; WMRP exec, later officer 2011- (Chair of Policy); Birmingham MBC 2003-, current Cabinet Member for Transport; succeeded Paul Tilsley as Idr of party group, 2016; with Ray Hassall (qv) prominent in re-establishing party as force in North Birmingham from late 1980s; committed Christian; serious minded with enormous capacity for hard work; some associates find him intense and lacking in humour; ably supported by activist wife Marcia in his various activities; **Birmingham, Perry Barr 2001, 2005, Cannock Chase 2010.** 

HUNT, Trevor, b 1942; supermarket entrepreneur; West Bromwich East 1974 Oct

HURDS, Mrs Lucy, ed Prim s, Ross-on-Wye, Hereford Sixth Form Coll; mother of four grown-up children; former book keeper, worked in PR, later cons/adviser to small businesses; spirited local campaigner, notably with Hands Up for Herefordshire; courageously tackled local Tory MP in media over his parliamentary expenses misdemeanors; WMRP Secretary, chair of fund raising; HQ Candidate Leadership Prog 2012; Herefordshire North 2010, Hereford 2015

HUSSAIN, Talib, b 1955 Kashmir, of Muslim background; trained Birmingham Mime & Speech Centre; actor; had small parts in films including James Bond epic, *Octopussy, Gandhi etc* and in various TV series; pursued a maverick career on Birmingham MBC; originally elected as a Labour cllr, he defected to the Lib Dem grp in 2003 over the invasion of Iraq; was a cabinet mbr for some months before he resigned in a dispute over grant allocations; subsequently sat as Ind, later joining the Conservatives, fighting a municipal election for that party shortly before his death; d 2011; **Birmingham, Sparkbrook 2005.** 

HUTCHISON, Robert, b 1941 ed St Paul's s, Trinity Coll., Dublin, U of E Anglia; writer, one time BBC TV presenter, later civil servant; with Policy Studies Inst 1982-86; serious minded, studious-looking but with strong sense of fun; founder, later chair, Winchester Action Group on Climate Change 2007; Winchester DC from 2010; **Shrewsbury 1987** 

INMAN, David, b 1936 ed King Edward's s, Birmingham, University Coll, London; solicitor; Hinckley DC, Leicestershire CC; **Nuneaton 1974 Feb**, Blaby (East Midlands Region) 1974 Oct

IQBAL, Shazad, b/raised Ladywood, of Muslim background; ed pr s in Aston, Wolverhampton U; joined Party 2006; community activist; interested in human rights, prevention of domestic violence, improving quality of life in inner city areas; **Birmingham Ladywood 2015** 

JACK, David, activist in Wolverhampton, fighting local elections to 2006; he was later adopted as PPC for Stoke-on-Trent North but was suspended while under investigation for allegedly sending offensive e-mails; he was exonerated when it was found he had been set up by a bogus company, Credit Card Killer, whose nefarious activities he had been investigating;

JOHNSON, Trevor, Newcastle MBC; said to have defected to the Conservatives; **Newcastle-under-Lyme 2005.** 

JONES, Fred, b 1949 ed sec mod s, adult ed coll; fork lift truck driver; former trade union activist with Union of Democratic Mine Workers; **Stoke-on-Trent South 1992**.

KEATING, Edward, ed Brunel U, Cornwall Coll, Redruth; former journalist later marketing cons; Weston-super-Mare; North Somerset DC; Warley 2010.

KEMP, William Herbert OBE, b 1881 Market Harborough, ed Market Harborough g s, Caterham Coll; pharmacist in Stoke-on-Trent from 1910; Stoke MBC, later Ald, for 30 years, Lord Mayor 1944-45; chair, North Staffordshire Liberal Fed; one of founders of Keele U 1949; he and his wife, chair of the local WVS, were pillars of local community for many years; in his single parliamentary election he polled just 8%; **Stoke-on-Trent South 1950**.

KENRICK, Joel, ed LSE, students' Union treasurer, Harvard U, United World College of the

Atlantic; joined party 2003 while protesting at UK/USA invasion of Iraq; worked for charities, with Department of Energy/Climate Change 2010-2012 working on funding of community energy/energy efficient projects; former parliamentary researcher; worked on international development projects in Africa, South East Asia; latterly strategy cons adviser to charities, businesses; Walsall South 2015

KEYES, Rod, b 1949? b in humble circumstances, West Bromwich, ed Sheffield U; ch ins; worked in insurance for over 30 years in posts all over country; active in union of insurance employees; now lives Ellesmere, North Shropshire; interested in inland waterways, the media; Leicestershire North West (East Midlands Region) 2005, **The Wrekin 2015** 

KHAN, Ayoub, b 1973 of Muslim background ed Duddeston Manor s, Josiah Mason Coll, Birmingham U, U of C.E.; has degrees in chemistry, engineering and the law; barrister, Birmingham DC 2003-12; cand for West Mids Police Commission 2012, by-e 2014; **Birmingham, Ladywood 2005, 2010.** 

KHAN, Tariq, of Muslim background, ed Duddeston Manor s, Hall Green Tech Coll, Wolverhampton U; sen medical rep; former Labour cllr, joined Lib Dems 2001, Birmingham MBC 2004-08, dpty grp ldr; Birmingham, Hodge Hill 2010.

KIDD, Heather, b 1954 Shoreham, Sussex, ed Kings Manor s, Shoreham, Sussex, Queen Mary Coll. London U, Chelsea Coll for Science Ed; science teacher in London/Sussex; joined party 1996; South Shropshire DC 1996 - leader 2003-07; always well groomed, personable and articulate; mother of four daughters; prominent in local Shropshire by-election victories 2010-11; lives Chirbury, Powys; LPO HQ Candidate Leadership Programme 2012; Ludlow 2010.

KILBY, Gordon, b 1940 ed Guildhall s, U of Wales, Open U; teacher; active with Rugby LDA; **Coventry South East 1983.** 

KING, Brian David, b 1936 Romford, Essex, ed Royal Liberty s, Romford, Birmingham U, Aston U; RAF service 1955-57, Chair, Birmingham U Lib Soc where he met Lionel King, Stuart Stockdale and David Hugill qqv; formed Ad Lib Group, an informal association of radical graduates; editor of its periodical Ad Lib (expired after two issues); teacher, later sen lect in FE; originally a committed Christian, he had intended to become a missionary in Latin America, later became a free thinker; has lived from 1960 at Handsworth, Birmingham; fought Birmingham MBC and West Midlands CC elections in 1960s and 70s; steadfastly opposed formidable Wallace Lawler's extra-constitutional activities in early 1960s - though they remained friends; WMRP officer 1960-79, closely associated with Roy Lewthwaite qv as key figures in the maintenance and development of party organization in West Midlands; encouraged the transition of the WMRP AGM into a mini-conference with political resolutions, side-events, panels etc; as Hon Treasurer advocate of several innovations, eventually widely adopted, such as a national party membership register, a local by-election guarantee fund etc; LPO Council/Exec 1960s to 1970s; dedicated to ideals of European Union, internationalism, anti-apartheid, some sympathy for CND; greatly encouraged Mihir Gupta gv in his campaign to establish a nation-wide body representative of the interests of Asian communities; left party c1980 partly through disillusionment at party's treatment of Jeremy Thorpe, antipathy to David Steel's brand of leadership etc; subsequently dedicated himself to professional career, pioneering the new discipline of Counselling; some critics considered him aloof and intense; remembered for his

KING, Lionel Arthur, b 1936 West Ham, London E, ed Leyton c h s, Birmingham U; (Chair Liberal Society); worked/studied in Spain/Portugal 1957-59 during dictatorships of Franco/ Salazar where his interest in politics and freedom was awakened; joined party attracted by ideas and personality of Jo Grimond; co-founder of Ad Lib Group; teacher, later sen lect in Media/TV Training in FE; lived Handsworth, Birmingham 1959-2004, Solihull 2004 to date; married Sally nee Lancaster 1964 1s, 1d; long-serving officer of WMLF/WMRP; LPO Council/Exec 1960s, chair WMLF 1962-64, taking over as vice-chair aged 26, in a crisis caused by the resignation of all senior officers; Federal Council 1996-2000; WMRP Exec 2008-10; Solihull & Meriden Exec 2005-; fought many Birmingham MBC elections 1960s/70s; originally approved as a potential parliamentary cand in 1960 (as of June 2016 believed to be the longest serving member of Liberal Candidates Assn); victim of the 'long knives' purge of PPCs 1979 involving Martyn Smith, Fran and Mike Oborski qqv; after an interval, unconditionally reinstated by LPO HQ; unaccountably side-lined when the party gained strength on Birmimingham MBC, his only official appointment was as a trustee of Handsworth Charities in early 2000s; officer for many years Handsworth LA/ Perry Barr LA; familiar face at by-elections at all levels in WM since 1961; after early retirement 1993, became writer/journalist/broadcaster on TV, local radio; most recently May 2015 on acclaimed BBC 2 programme on Winston Churchill, When Britain Said No; contestant numerous TV/radio quiz shows; active in community relations; interested in housing, long-serving mbr board of Midland Area Improvement Housing Association; mbr NATFHE, later NUJ; West Bromwich Trades Council in 1970s; conducted TV training courses for WMR PPCs from mid 1980s; prolific writer of letters to press; campaigned for many years against LPO HQ reluctance to stage Party Assembly in Birmingham; finally vindicated when English and Federal Parties chose as venue Birmingham ICC in 2010 and 2011; takes himself and Liberalism very seriously though his somewhat zany, over-the-top, sense of humour is never far away; though widely known in party circles, has few political intimates; though a persistent campaigner (fought Solihull MBC elections 2012 - over 50 years after his first contest in Birminghaam), Balsall PC from 2008; said to lack the ruthless quality which makes for a successful campaigner/politician; neither does his intellectual brand of Liberalism readily adapt to doorstep campaigning; a free thinker with Humanist leanings, interests incl Europe, parliamentary reform, the imbalance of wealth, Latin America, languages, inland waterways restoration, writing short stories; life-long interest in jazz; ardent cricket follower, still playing at club level 2016, Warwickshire CC Over 70s XI; awarded B.E.M. 2016; Kidderminster 1964, Sutton Coldfield 1970, Walsall South 1987 (not related to Brian King qv of whom he was long a political associate.)

KIRBY, Richard, b 1973 ed Graham Balfour h s, Stafford, Oxford U; health service man; mbr ERS; Cannock Chase 1997.

KIRK, William Watson, b 1915?, Scotland; entrepreneur/businessman; pioneer in employment of discharged mental patients, innovator in payment of his workers by cheque; (technically illegal until 1960s); was a typical example of the 'fly-by-nights' who joined the Wallace Lawler qv

entourage in early 1960s, not taken seriously by colleagues or opponents alike; styled by press as 'the perky Mr Kirk'; one of his by-election meetings was graced by Laura Grimond qv (Scotland), the party leader's wife as a guest speaker; remembered for his unconvincing, often incoherent speeches, the deplorable condition of his teeth and the ever present smell of whisky about him; he subsequently spent some time as a guest of HM prison services; **Birmingham**, **Small Heath by-e 1961.** 

LAITINEN, William, b 1981, Vermont, USA; grandson of Finnish immigrant; studied in USA; man dir of company; lived Solihull; active with Solihull LDA; **Meriden 2005.** 

LAMB, Dr H. H. Brian, b 1919 Armagh, Northern Ireland ed Armagh Royal s, Trinity Coll, Dublin; respected GP in Kidderminster; lived Wolverley, nr Kidderminster; an early subscriber to *Private Eye*, which he received by post because local newsagents were nervous about stocking it in its early months of publication; larger-than-life figure with rebellious side; enthusiast of work of Brendan Behan and early subscriber to *Private Eye*; popular figure, remembered for his extravert personality, generosity, bonhomie, strong speaking voice, commitment, Irish charm and toothbrush moustache; his wife Renee, who served briefly on Wolverley PC, was a party activist with strong opinions, relishing controversy; d 1997; **Kidderminster 1970** 

LAMB, (Major) Richard A., b 1911; of catholic background; ed Oxford U; service WW II; from Cumbrian land-owning family; farmer and agriculturalist; defected to Conservatives (for whom he fought Stockton-on-Tees (Northern Counties)1950); returned to Liberals early 1960s; one time editor of party periodical *New Outlook;* later wrote several polemical books about the Italian campaign in WW II, British politics etc; one-time close associate of Jeremy Thorpe; influential contributor to party policy on agriculture; d 1999; **Lichfield 1945**, Dorset North 1964, 1966 (South West Region).

LAMBERT, Anthony (Tony), b1943 ed Hitchin g s, Oxford U; asst postal controller, later GPO sen auditor; Thornbury TC (Gloucestershire) in 1970s later fought Birmingham MB elections; made a strong impression during his short connection with WMRP; remembered for his supreme self-confidence, aggressive electioneering and skill in speedily drafting text of leaflets; energetic campaigner, strong personality; his tragically early death at Gloucester c 1985 was a great loss to the party; Gloucestershire South (South West Region) 1970, **Staffordshire South West 1974 Oct** , Newport, Monmouth (Wales) 1979, Caerphilly (Wales) 1983.

LANE, Nicholas, b 1983, Solihull ed local schools in Henley-in-Arden, King Edward VI s, Stratford-upon-Avon, Bristol U, Kings Coll, London, Coll of Law; barrister and bio-chemist; former aide to Norman Baker MP at Westminster; Editor-in-Chief, *Who's Who in Lib Dems?* 2011; **Redditch 2010.** 

LAURIE, Alan, b 1922; ed Cambridge U; warden of adult education coll; **Shrewsbury 1979.**.

LAWLER, Wallace Leslie, b 15/3/1912, Worcester, ed St Paul's s, Worcester; plastics manufacturer; lived Handsworth, later King's Heath, Birmingham; service WW II; founder

member of Public Opinion Action 1943; interest in public affairs from youth; one of only four party cands in West Midlands at 1955 General Election; long-time chair BLO, WMLF officer, LPO Council and Exec (Vice-Pres 1968).

Gifted with a powerful voice, a formidable, emotional, if at times prolix public speaker, he was noted for his hyperbole and malapropisms, mispronunciations eg 'omes before hoffices,' misuse of vocabulary eg ' redundant constituencies without any Liberal organisation' He had a great flair for publicity and was seldom out of media attention. He could not be ignored even by fiercely hostile Birmingham press. He was detested by both Labour and Conservative civic leaders for daring to challenge their 'duopoly' while his high-handed behaviour and boundless personal ambition often aroused strong opposition from within his own camp. He was hopelessly at odds on many issues with younger colleagues of Liberal group towards the end of his career Paul Tilsley, Dennis Minnis, Graham Gopsill qqv. He was a sincere and tireless champion of the many causes he embraced; the homeless, small businessmen, victims of villainous landlords, self-build housing groups, council tenants, Inner City problems, OAPs, youth clubs, National Health workers.

Claiming to be non-political until his late 30s, he went on to contest numerous local elections for Birmingham City council finally being elected for Newtown Ward in 1962, the first Liberal in the chamber for 30 years serving until his death, latterly as an alderman. It was four years before a colleague, Ken Hardeman qv, was elected to join him. He was effectively leader of a Liberal group only from 1966-72. His electioneering methods became known as 'community politics' and were widely adopted elsewhere, with outstanding success in Liverpool. They were also strongly favoured by the YL leaders who sponsored successfully an Assembly resolution calling for the party to adopt 'community politics' as a campaign strategy. He also enjoyed considerable rapport with the YLs for his anti-party establishment views. In Birmingham the Lawler appeal generally fell upon deaf ears outside the Inner City, his approach proving unsuited to Conservative-inclined wards. It was not until after his death that younger Liberal candidates began to win seats on the edge of the city such as Sheldon, Yardley and Acocks Green.

All these strands, Lawlerism, community politics, Inner City problems, the support of the YLs – fused admirably at the Ladywood to achieve his by-election victory in the summer of 1969. Already a sick man when elected as the first Liberal MP in Birmingham since 1880s, he became a vociferous advocate of all his chosen causes in the Commons being appointed party spokesman on Housing and the Home Office. His spirited attacks on the Labour government's record on housing brought upon him the hatred of their front bench and he was regularly shouted down by back benchers. But he proved an effective performer. In the disaster which befell the party at the General Election of 1970, he lost his seat after serving his troubled constituency for just 364 days. At the time of his death through lung cancer, after a long illness, bravely borne, he had already been adopted as PPC for the revised Birmingham, Small Heath constituency.

Lawler was one of the first figures in local government to voice opposition to the indiscriminate and wholesale redevelopment of inner city areas, which he termed 'municipal fascism.' He welcomed the end of slums and sub-standard dwellings in Birmingham, many of which were over a century old. What he demanded was more thought, public consultation and imaginative planning with an increased emphasis on refurbishment of properties, small industrial premises, public buildings and expanded inner city facilities. He believed that in their haste to push through their plans, local authorities were destroying established communities and patterns of

life and work. Birmingham's industrial might and great wealth had been founded in the C19th by entrepreneurs who had set up their businesses in central Birmingham. Many hundreds of these, involved in precision and metals, still employed thousands of workers, many of them middle-aged, who lived often conveniently close to the workplace. All these factors had been overlooked. Many of these small business had simply closed, others after much disruption, had been re-located on industrial estates on the city boundaries. Many highly skilled workers, technicians and craftsmen, had lost their jobs or were obliged to become commuters. Lawler believed that the very existence of Birmingham as Britain's premier industrial city was at stake.

He deplored the building of high-rise tower blocks on bleak, impersonal estates, drawing attention to the consequences of the break-down of communities, particularly when thousands of uprooted families were re-settled on giant estates, such as Castle Vale, Erdington which was to become a by word for social engineering disasters of this kind. Birmingham's housing shortage could not be ended at a stroke in this way, particularly when the policy created unforeseen social problems. He feared tensions arising among a new generation of rootless youth, no longer subject to the benign influence of a network of close relatives, life-long friends and neighbours. His doubts were dismissed by his opponents as being those of 'an alarmist reactionary, standing in the way of progress,' 'nostalgic day dreaming' etc though he did attract the attention of the Bishop of Birmingham, some local religious groups and more perceptive sociologists. Sadly nearly all his worst fears were realized.

Lawler championed from his election to the City Council the introduction of Organisation & Methods surveys, then a radical departure, into council departments. These he advised should be undertaken by outside firms, rather than by internal procedure. He was prompted by possibilities of savings being made and raising standards of efficiency. The suggestion was summarily rejected by the Labour-controlled Council, who not without cause, believed that adverse reports would call into question the efficiency of their administration. The Conservative opposition concurred, claiming the possible savings would not cover the fees payable to O & M firms. Leaders of the enormous staff of local government officers, fearing redundancies, also fiercely opposed the idea. It is likely that Lawler even at this stage suspected corruption in some council departments, particularly those concerned with the redevelopment of the city, many of the contracts awarded involving millions of pounds. Eventually the Council engaged an O & M firm to undertake a survey in probably the least typical of all council departments, that of the Town Clerk. The final report suggested savings, if the recommendations were implemented, of hundreds of thousands of pounds. As for his suspicions of corruption, the city was stunned some years later when, after a sensational trial, the City Architect and leading official of a major local building firm were jailed. In some areas of the country where urban redevelopment was taking place on a similar scale to Birmingham, for example the North East, legal proceedings led to the imprisonment of civic leaders among them T Dan Smith. Lawler would have believed a number of Birmingham council personalities deserved a similar fate.

Lawler was an early, lone advocate of a 20 m.p.h speed limit in side-streets and pedestrianisation of the City Centre, calling for the exclusion of private vehicles from within the Inner Ring Road. Though derided at the time these measures were introduced some years later, though in a piece meal fashion. He would have welcomed the imaginative redevelopment of the canal basins at Gas Street, the attractive focus of Birmingham's dining, entertainment and conference facilities. He would have fully approved of putting derelict industrial land back into use, particularly those which had been neglected by the council for decades. The city's canal

network figured in another of Lawler's many ideas which were years ahead of their time reclamation and recycling. 'Birmingham could live of its own rubbish!' he once informed an incredulous council, where he was again mocked and jeered. Alderman Frank Griffin, the Conservative leader who harboured an unconcealed contempt for Lawler and Liberals in general, commented, 'You can scarcely trust the average Brummie to put rubbish in his own dustbin, let alone carry it to the end of the street!' the Birmingham newspapers were equally dismissive, devoting editorials to demolishing the latest Liberal 'crazy idea.' Lawler envisaged the systematic collection Birmingham's industrial, commercial and domestic waste, with depots established at derelict canal basins. He reminded the council of the resounding success of the door-to-door collection of food waste for municipally-run pig farms for six years during the war. 'If it could work when people were on strict food rations, it could work when people are throwing food away.' He favoured a community-run system in which people could dispose of waste of all kinds at designated collection centres. Once again, within years of his death, bottle, clothes and waste paper banks were being placed on street corners in selected areas, the bins being regularly filled to capacity. The pollution scandal at Perry Barr where toxic waste was discharged directly into the River Tame by local industry, another abuse he raised in council, was not successfully countered until many years later.

Probably the pre-eminent figure in the civic life of the city in his day, Lawler is remembered for his boundless energy, enthusiasm, dominant personality, sense of humour, countless anecdotes, hysterical laugh, broken spectacles and silver clothes brush. On the minus side were his mischievous intrusions into local party and regional organization together with his propensity to adopt on impulse, and promote the interests of, a succession of individuals, cynical chancers and adventurers and others with doubtful antecedents. His equivocal views on immigration laid him open to accusations of racism, though he had intimates among the city's Jewish personalities. He also encouraged a community-minded West Indian GP, Dr Barnabus to enter public life in the early 1950s. Then there was his uncontrollable coughing in public arising from his chain-smoking which led to his premature demise.

Lawler's importance in the re-establishment, from nothing, of the party in Birmingham and beyond its boundaries in the 1950s and 60s, cannot be exaggerated. His memorial service in Birmingham Cathedral drew an enormous number of mourners, the address being delivered by the party leader, Jeremy Thorpe. It has only recently been appreciated that Lawler stood in a direct line of succession to those mid C19th enlightened industrialists, Liberal entrepreneurs, small businessmen and radical reformers such as the Chamberlains and Cadburys, whose endeavors established the city as one of the most advanced municipalities in the world. His 365 day term at Westminster when he was already a very sick man was hardly enough to allow him to make a strong impression but he regularly challenged and provoked Labour government figures on their housing record. He served as a member of the select Comm on race relations and Immigration. Since his death Lawler has been the subject of several unpublished doctoral theses by PhD students; d 28/9/1972, Birmingham; Dudley 1955, Birmingham, Perry Barr 1959, Handsworth 1964, Ladywood 1966, by-e 1969, 1970; MP 1969-70; See Dictionary of Liberal Biography

LAWRENCE, Robin, teacher; joined party 2010; Wolverhampton MBC; chair health scrutiny panel; **Wolverhampton South West 2010.** 

LEIGHTON, Alan, broadcaster with Radio WM (BBC), an early 'agony uncle' with many regional

listeners in mid 1970s; fleetingly involved with party in the by-e which was fought in a constituency previously uncontested for many years; later moved to London; **Coventry North West by-e 1976.** 

LEWIS, (Dame) Barbara Estelle, later Sheffield; b Smethwick 1919; ed Birmingham U; academic; lecturer in Social Sciences, Birmingham U 1945-56; Foreign Office Control Commissioner in Germany 1945, Academic Dir, Buckingham U 1972-73; became a strong advocate of the free market revolution; author of papers on the role of voluntary services, co-author *The Aged and the Nation*; senior officer of various national bodies, including WVS; as her influence grew she became an advisor of Margaret Thatcher on the right-wing policies with which the former PM is associated; widowed when her first husband was killed serving with the RAF 1941, she later married a colleague, A.A. Sheffield qv; in 1951 she fought one of the two or three constituencies the party had not contested in the country in 1950, losing her deposit by a small margin; Walsall was one of only three seats in the West Midlands fought by the party in 1951; exec LPO; d 2004; Birmingham, Handsworth 1945, Walsall 1951.

LEWIS, Gerald P.T., b Haverford West, Pembrokeshire, 1926, ed Belfast U, Aberdeen U, Birmingham U; originally a farmer, student counsellor at Dudley Coll from 1974; of retiring personality, but a dogged campaigner; joined party 1976, fighting seven elections in 26 years; both he and his wife are long serving activists in Dudley; widely respected in WMRP circles; mbr Amnesty Int, Dudley Racial Equality Council; his wife Anne has campaigned steadfastly at his side; **Dudley East 1979, Dudley West 1983, 1987, 1992, Dudley North 1997, 2005** 

LEWIS, Martin; raised in Staffordshire, ed Stafford; lives Newcastle-under-Lyme; ret civil servant; fought on record of the party in coalition; **Stone 2015** 

LEWTHWAITE, Roy, b 1929 ed King Edward's s, Birmingham, lived King's Heath, later Charford Lodge, Bromsgrove, from where he worked for the WMRP for many years; member of Society of Friends; originally Labour activist; joined party c 1960; fought many Birmingham MBC elections; full-time professional organiser for WMLF/WMRP 1967-87; responsible for maintaining party fabric in West Midlands and master-minding great expansion of party activity in local government; set up Regional Interview Panel for PPCs; under his direction the party widened its front to contest every seat in region for first time by October 1974 whilst maintaining a highly acceptable standard of candidate; prominent in electoral negotiations with SDP at general elections of 1983/87 when the Alliance again contested every West Midlands constituency; remembered for his integrity and Job-like patience in time of adversity, eg the General Elections of 1970 and 1979; of formidable voice, unflappable tenacity, resilience, dry sense of humour and hearty laugh; the party had no better servant in its bleakest years; avoided intrigue, setting high standard of probity; narrowly missed out on top-level LPO appointment; later dabbled in property development and refurbishing with his wife Dr Ruth L. who contested several Birmingham local elections; Ruth and Roy died within a few weeks of each other in the spring of 2012, their joint memorial service at Barnt Green Friends Meeting House being the occasion of a very well-attended reunion of party personalities and friends; their daughter Sarah was an energetic YL activist locally and at University, before joining the BBC; now a lect in FE at Blackburn, she is the partner of TV political commentator, Gary O'Donohue; Birmingham, Northfield 1964, Selly Oak 1966, Birmingham, Northfield 1979.

LING, Philip, b Leamington, of Chinese background ed Bath U; former asst economist in Prime

Minister's Strategy Unit, later bank analyst, currently with Thomson Reuters; joined party 2007; treasurer Chinese Lib Dems; chair Bromley LDA; left positive impression; **Bromsgrove 2010**, Tooting (Greater London) 2015

LLOYD, J. N.G. (Nick), b 1930 ed Chorlton-cum-Hardy g s, Tech Faculty, Manchester U; optician; lived Wellington, Salop; Wellington UDC from 1961; capable speaker with sharp edge to his tongue, particularly scathing in his attacks upon middle-class petty-mindedness and nouveau riche attitudes which he saw as epitomising Conservative values of the day; wrote pithy letters to Wolverhampton Express and Star; remembered for the dry humour of his occasional column Through the Salopian Folds in WMLF Newsletter; died c 1975 by his own hand in fit of depression caused by guilt over an extra-marital affair; remembered for his seemingly cool, laid-back approach; Wolverhampton South West 1964.

LOCKYER, Peter, b 1950 ed Milton Keynes Coll of Education; teacher; believed to have contested Birmingham MBC elections; **Birmingham, Hall Green 1979.** 

LOMAX, Brian, b 1948 ed De La Salle Coll, Salford, Cambridge U; probation officer; Oldham West (North West Region) 1970, Knutsford (North West Region) 1974 Feb, Oct, **Rugby 1979**.

MacDONALD, David, b 1987 Burton-on-Trent, ed William Shrewsbury s, Ferrers Acad; political agent/organiser; worked in South London constituencies for Paul Burstow MP, earlier Tom Brake MP qqv (Greater London); his highly promising promising career was tragically cut short by his untimely death, apparently from an epilectic seizure in August 2015; **Burton-on-Trent 2015** 

MacDONALD, Dr Gordon, b 1968 ed Douglas Acad, Milngavie, Strathclyde, Glasgow U; lect; **Coventry South 1997,** Strathkelvin & Bearsden (Scotland) 2001, East Renfrewshire (Scotland) 2005.

McELDOWNEY, Rev. W. J., b 1889 Wellington, New Zealand, ed Victoria U Coll, Manchester Coll, Oxford U ?; service with Anzacs in WW I; originally a solicitor; in UK from 1933; trained as Unitarian minister, later incumbent at Newcastle-under-Lyme; described in press as a capable public speaker; possibly a Martell Plan cand; **Stafford 1950.** 

McGRATH, David, b 1960; business development man; Birmingham MBC, chair Birmingham party 1989-90; **Birmingham, Hall Green 1992.** 

McGUFFIE, Duncan G., fruit farmer, radio broadcaster on farming; lived near Alcester, Warwickshire; **Evesham 1945.** 

McKEE, (Dr) Vincent, b 1958 ed Downpatrick Coll, Belfast Coll of Business Studies, City of London Poly, Birmingham Poly; author of studies on Scottish/Irish Gaelic and contemporary politics, lecturer; mbr ERS; holds some strongly dissenting views e.g. on termination of pregnancies; several times local election candidate to 2006; lives Coventry; penchant for attracting media attention; suspended from Party membership early in 2011 following ITN investigation; Coventry North East 1992, Coventry South 2001, 2005, Coventry North West 2010.

McKEOWN, Brendan, works for Dudley Community Volunteer Service; lives Mid Staffordshire; Stafford MBC; **Stone 2001.** 

McLEAN, Laurence (Larry), b 1931 ed St Chad's s, Wolverhampton; ch acc; long active with party in Wolverhampton, to whom he was a generous donor; remembered for his innumerable pithy letters to the local press, many of them witty ripostes to his brother whose politics were diametrically opposed; (believed to have died c 1998); **Wolverhampton North East 1979.** 

MANDER, Sir Geoffrey Le Mesurier, b 1882 ed Harrow s, Cambridge U; from an affluent local family of land-owners and industrialists; originally trained as a barrister; later man dir of family paint bus; lived at ancestral home of Wightwick Manor, Wolverhampton ( later bequeathed to the National Trust); Wolverhampton MBC 1911-20; fought Stourbridge, Cannock and Leominster for party in early 1920s; lost seat on huge swing to left, the last Liberal MP in the region for 24 years; bitter opponent of Chamberlain's Appeasement policies prior to 1939; earned reputation for incisive questioning of Ministers in the Commons; author of *We Were Not All Wrong* 1941; Private Sec. to Sir Archibald Sinclair at Air Ministry in Churchill's war time Coalition Government; after losing seat in July 1945, joined Labour; Staffordshire CC in late 1940s; d 1962; MP Wolverhampton East 1929-45; the Mander Centre, a vast shopping complex built in Wolverhampton c1980 bears the family name. A personality of whom there is doubtless much more of interest to discover.

MARSH, William (Bill), b 1914 ed Smethwick Tech, Wolsey Hall; Royal Navy WW II as petty officer; lived Shrewsbury; long-serving Shrewsbury MBC; LPO Council c1962; had firsthand experience of the evils of apartheid; remembered for his formidable voice, powerful debating style and menacing beard; dominant personality in Shrewsbury party circles and beyond for three decades; d c 1990; **Shrewsbury 1966, 1974 Feb, Oct** 

MARSHALL, Hon Sir Archie Pellew, b 1899 ed Truro s, Cambridge U; pres of Union; service in WW I; practised as barrister in Birmingham 1925-47; involved with BLO in 1920s and 30s, Pres 1945; KC 1947; opposed to party's rightward drift under Clement Davies 1947-50, he made overtures to Labour figures with a view to agreeing on a limited electoral arrangement to keep the Attlee government in power; these secret talks were aborted when the Premier made a snap decision to call an early general election; dropped out of political activity in the early 1950s; made 1959 High Court judge later presiding over the trial of Dr Stephen Ward in the aftermath of the Profumo scandal which rocked the MacMillan Government in 1963; there have been allegations that the trial was rigged and that vital evidence was suppressed; associated with Radical Action Group in early 1940s, unsuccessful candidate for LPO office in 1944, President of BLO 1945; the last party figure of any consequence in city for nearly 20 years; d 1966; Birmingham, Kings Norton 1929, 1931, Hereford 1945. Another personality of whom there is surely more to discover.

MARTIN, Alan, b 1951 ed Alexandra h s, Tipton, Brighton Poly, Birmingham U; research asst; **Dudley West 1974 Oct** 

MARTIN, Andrew, Stoke-on-Trent South 2005

MARTIN, Harold, b 1944 ed Grove s, Wrexham, Wolverhampton Poly; marketing cons; **Stafford & Stone 1974 Feb, Oct** 

MARTIN, Dr (later Professor) Edward Stephen, b 1944 ed High Pavement s, Nottingham, Nottingham U, Reading U, U of Saskatchewan; academic; Plymouth Poly; HMI for Education, ind cons; lives South Littleton, Worcestershire; Euro cand 1999; stepped into a vacancy at very short notice 2010; his wife Maureen (b Canada 1945), also an academic, has been a party activist since 1971 latterly in Mid Worcestershire; Tewkesbury (South West Region) 2001, Warwickshire North 2010

MARWA, Sardul b 1947, ed Sandwell sec s, Chance Tech Coll; lect; prominent member of Sikh community; served on numerous public and official bodies; Birmingham MBC 1982-88 (Labour); WMRP Exec 1997-98; he was fast tracked in a highly questionable manner (following extraordinary LPO HQ pressure on WMRP; q v Jenny Pinkett) for Westminster and European elections; spent inordinate sum on his single parliamentary campaign; ceased to be active shortly after; a great disappointment considering the absurdly generous sponsorship he received; remembered for his sense of humor, bland opinions; **Birmingham, Ladywood 1997** 

MAWLE, Norman William (Bill), b 1895; man dir of Imperial Typewriters, West Bromwich; air ace in Royal Flying Corps, WW I; a natty dresser; remembered for his generosity and genial manner; appeared from nowhere announcing himself available to fight the hitherto derelict Black Country constituency of West Bromwich, uncontested by the party since 1931; received generous support from party HQ with Jo Grimond addressing a well-attended, traditional Town Hall rally; he polled respectably and announced plans to fight again, appointing a paid, party certificated agent; it is believed health problems caused his resignation at the eleventh hour before the General Election 1964; d Leicester 1972; **West Bromwich by-e 1963.** 

MEREDITH, Alan, b 1922 ed Darwen g s, Manchester U, teacher; lived Nuneaton; Nuneaton MBC 1960s; **Nuneaton 1966, by-e 1967.** 

MERRITT, M/s Ruth, b 1929 ed London U, Open U; Oakham TC, Rutland 1974-78; Stroud DC 1990; Warwickshire CC; mbr Rivers Advisory Comm, Severn-Trent Region; **Nuneaton 1992.** 

MIDDLETON, Charles Frederick, b 1895?; RAF service WW II; jeweller/watchmaker; **Birmingham, Yardley 1945.** 

MIDDLETON, (Capt) G. C., b 1925 ed King's s, Canterbury, Oxford U, RMC, Sandhurst; military career, serving in Malaya; former Young Conservative; at 25 one of the youngest cands at the 1951 General Election; Nuneaton was one of the three constituencies the party contested in the West Midlands, thus preserving the local party's tradition of always nominating a candidate; **Nuneaton 1951.** 

MILLER, Keith; last minute nominee, viciously attacked in local Labour blogs as 'a tissue paper cand from London'; made a rather hesitant and apologetic attempt to defend the party's record on Radio Stafford during campaign; **Stafford 2015** 

MILLS, Julia, b 1915, ed Erdington g s, London Coll of Music, cllr later Mayor, Sutton Coldfield MB; Warwickshire CC from 1964; teacher; with her husband Donald, also cllr, who predeceased her, stalwarts in Sutton Coldfield public life for many years; campaigned unsuccessfully against merger of Sutton Coldfield with Birmingham; fought total of seventeen elections for party at all

levels; advocated just and humane treatment of gypsies and travellers and for provision of designated sites; held advanced views on many social matters; remembered for her kindly, humane approach to politics, encouragement to younger hopefuls and her grande femme, maternal appearance; active with party almost until her death; a great-great-grandmother who left numerous descendants; d 2002; fought Derby South (East Midlands) 1974 Feb, **Birmingham, Erdington 1974 Oct** 

MINNIS, Dennis, b 1938 ed St Alban's C of E s, lived Hall Green, later Edgbaston; prominent and dynamic figure in party in Birmingham 1960s to 1980s; had own import/export bus, later trouble shooter for travel firm; one time full time political organiser/agent, at Orpington in 1960s for Eric Lubbock MP; fought numerous local elections in Birmingham from 1960, finally gaining a seat at Duddeston Ward in late 1960s; close associate of Wallace Lawler qv, (with whom he had several heated differences of opinion); highly active in Lawler-inspired community politics style of campaigning in Inner City wards; Birmingham MBC 1970-76; defected to Labour c1980, possibly attracted by that party's unilateral policies; after long interval returned to Council, becoming Cabinet Chair (Housing); lost seat 2002, elected Hon Ald; later became youth worker and Warden of St Basil's Hostel; attempted comeback to Council 2012; remembered for his herculean appetite for hard work, zest for the fight, organising and campaigning skills, flair for publicity, integrity, sense of fun, beaming smile, ready sense of humour, approachability; his defection at a time when the party was on the threshold of a new break-through in the city, was greatly regretted; Birmingham, All Saints 1970, Birmingham, Small Heath 1974 Feb, Meriden 1974 Oct, Birmingham, Small Heath 1979

MIRFIN, Derick, b 1930? Sheffield; ed Cambridge U, Chair of the Union; associated with Radical Reform Group in 1950s and 60s; former member LPO Council; publisher with Liberal-inclined Pall Mall Press, one time Editor, Pall Mall Quarterly; author and translator; in his day a highly regarded prospect in party circles; an unlikely choice for an industrial Black Country constituency, one of only four in the West Midlands willing to fight, with only a residual idiosyncratic party tradition based on Liberal Clubs, he restored the local vote to a respectable level in 1955 and improved upon it in 1959; his adoption for the crucial Stratford-upon-Avon by-election August 1963 (prompted by the Profumo affair) was urged by LPO HQ; he polled well in a constituency with no Liberal tradition; his election speeches, possibly a trifle too subtly worded for his audience, were full of witty touches, some being taken up by the media egg 'this is one garden I am determined Maud will not come into', (his Conservative opponent being one, Angus Maude); remembered for his sharp intellect, stinging one-liners, profound grasp of issues and suave demeanor; the site of him dancing the Twist at a constituency social event, however, was a sight to make the blood run cold; the result of the by- election influenced Premier Douglas Home's decision to postpone an intended general election for a further year; believed to have been removed from the approved list of possible cands during the 'Long Knives' purge at the outset of the Steel leadership 1977-78; Basingstoke MB from c1995, Mayor 1998-99; his retirement from active politics for two decades was a major loss; Oldbury & Halesowen 1955, 1959, Stratford-upon-Avon by-e 1963, 1964, Penistone (Yorkshire Region) 1970.

MITCHELL, Noel, b 1938 ed Leicester U; PE teacher, later sec headmaster; **Warwickshire North** 1992.

MOKRCZYCKI, Jan, b 1932 Poland; dentist practising in Coventry; rumours of death in 1990s happily unfounded; ed Thornleigh Coll, Bolton, Sutherland Dental School, Durham U; asst sec

N.U.S 1959-60; believed to have taken part aged 12 in the heroic but ill-fated Warsaw uprising against the Nazis in 1944; escaped to Britain; took UK nationality; lived Coventry, later active with Kenilworth LDA; a leading figure in the UK ex-pat Polish community; campaigned for a memorial for the victims of Katyn Massacres by the Russians of Polish prisoners in 1939-40; took part in eventual memorial dedication services 2010; **Coventry East 1966**, Loughborough (East Midlands) 1970.

MORGAN-HARRIS, George, b 1902?; service in WW I with RNAS after joining RFC; aero eng, test pilot, later owner of air transport co; a strange choice of cand, with no known previous involvement with the party for a constituency which it had come very close to winning in 1945; **Leominster 1950.** 

MORRIS, Mrs Judy A., b 1944 ed Riland Bedford h s, Sutton Coldfield, Warwick U; housewife; Solihull MBC; **Meriden 1992.** 

MORRIS, Stephen, b 1955 ed Hereford Cathedral s, Exeter U, Sussex U; co dir, tech author; **Leominster 1987.** 

MURRAY, David, b 1939 Cottingham, East Yorkshire, ed Culford s, Bury St Edmunds, Cambridge Coll of Arts & Tech, Wolverhampton Poly; lect, CEng; co dir; founded own co; bus cons; joined party c1967; fought numerous elections; Cambridge MBC from 1970; moved to Shropshire; Bridgnorth DC from 2003; Albrighton PC, Shifnal TC; prominent member WMRP exec; adopted for The Wrekin 2010, he was obliged to withdraw at the eleventh hour for personal reasons; of serious, purposeful demeanour; **Wolverhampton South East 2005** 

MYERS, Mrs Hilary, b Bristol 1956 ed Reading U, Manchester Met U; long career in health/social care, employment adviser to people with disabilities; served as a district/town cllr in her native West Yorkshire where she was involved in major community projects; now lives Evesham; supporter of PR/votes at 16; Calder Valley (Yorkshire Region) 2015, **Redditch 2015**.

NEWMAN, M/s Patricia, b 1929 ed Bournemouth g s; freelance editor/writer; **Coventry North West 1974 Oct** 

NIBLETT, Brian, b 1957 ed Filton h s, Bristol, Salford U, West of England U; public affairs manager; believed to have been a close associate of Matthew Green qv; an intense, prickly individual, somewhat over-confident in his abilities; **Wolverhampton North East 1997**, Bristol East (South West Region) 2001.

NORCOTT, Barry, b 1941 ed Haymill sec mod s, Merchant Seamen's Coll; voluntary social worker and househusband; remembered as something of a rebel and individualist; **Wolverhampton South East 1974 Oct**, Feltham & Heston, (Greater London) 1979.

OBORSKI, Mrs Frances, (Fran) Mary OBE b 1945 London, ed Bassaley, Newport. Gwent, Birmingham U, Oxford U; joined ULS 1966; Wyre Forest DC for over 40 years from from 1973; Worcs-Hereford CC, former WMRP officer; member, WMPC Selection Comm during 'Long

Knives' purge 1979-80; diminutive, vociferous, formidable local campaigner in innumerable causes, an early advocate of regular mass delivery of Liberal Focus leaflets; of stubbornly individualistic temperament; Euro Candidate 1989 as Lib Dem; remained with the 'continuing' Liberals after merger with SDP, serving as their National Pres/Chair, standing in general elections for that grouping at Stoke Central 1997, Wyre Forest 2005; an unlikely 'scarlet lady' who hit national press headlines following an alleged liaison with a senior Wyre Forest DC official; remembered for her energy, strong personality, courage in adversity and cider apple voice; widow of Mike O. (also on Wyre Forest DC and group leader d 2003); a Polish Hon Consul; subsequently re-joined Lib Dems in June 2015 after the severe reverses in the General Election, stating that it was vital that all Liberals should unite everywhere; impressive speaker at Regional Assembly Nov 2015; Walsall North by-e 1976, Staffordshire South 1987.

O'BRIEN, M/s Tracey, b 1963 St Ambrose Barlow RC s m s, Wolverhampton U; advice worker/trainer; pioneer in training of candidates; long-term hard-working WMRP officer; effusive, chirpy personality; **Walsall North 1997.** 

ODDIE, Christopher (later Hon.), b 1929 ed Giggleswick s, Oxford U; barrister, later appointed judge; author *Science and the Administration of Justice* pub 1991; **Ludlow 1970.** 

OSBORNE, David, b 1942 ed Queen Elizabeth g s, Mansfield, City of Worcester T T Coll, Birmingham U; FE lect; sen national officer NATFHE; Birmingham MBC; remembered for his witty speeches in Council chamber; irrepressible, often irreverent sense of humour; Birmingham, Selly Oak 1992, 1997, 2001

OTTER, Robin, b 1926 ed Marlborough s, Oxford U; solicitor former district commissioner, Kenya; raised rare breed of Gloucestershire cattle; active professionally until his late 70s; Euro candidate 1979; remembered as a serious-minded campaigner, for his commitment and stiff military bearing; **Worcestershire South 1966**, Westbury 1970, Cirencester (both South West Region) 1974 Feb

OWEN, Douglas b 1932 ed Berkhamstead s, Imperial Coll, Loughborough U; sen lect, Lanchester Coll of T'nology; Warley West 1974 Oct

OWEN, H. Frank, b 1905, in Widemarsh St, Hereford, near the Liberal Club; from his youth a staunch admirer and later close supporter of Lloyd George; after 1931 rose to eminence on Fleet Street as a journalist; Editor, *Evening Standard* 1938, *Daily Mail* 1947-50; later TV interviewer; in July 1940 after the fall of the Chamberlain government he was co-author with Michael Foot and Peter Howard of *Guilty Men*, one of the most apposite and influential political polemic of all time, published pseudonymously in 1940, which savagely exposed the Conservative-dominated National Government of 1931-40 and identified those responsible for Appeasement and Britain's ill-preparedness for WW II; 200,000 copies were sold within days without profit to the authors, the rogue publisher having made off with the proceeds; service WW II, reaching rank of Lieut. Col; later wrote early acclaimed biography of his idol David Lloyd-George, *Tempestuous Journey;* author of several books on war and current affairs; early ITV journalist; attempted a political comeback in 1955-56, as one of only five party cands in the West Midlands, polling well in his old constituency after 25 years absence; did even better in by-election; said to have died in penury, of alcoholism, 1979 at Worthing; Hereford 1929, 1931 MP 1929-31, Hereford 1955, by-e 1956; see *Dictionary of Liberal Biography* 

OWEN-JONES, David b 1949 ed Llandovery Coll, London U; barrister, later circuit judge; Carmarthen 1974 Feb, Oct (Wales), **Rugby 1983, 1987.** 

PARRY, David, b 1957 ed St Alban's g s, Reading U; architectural cons; St Albans DC 1984-88; **Birmingham, Sparkbrook 1992.** 

PARRY, John Kelsall, b 1927 ed Liverpool Coll s, Cambridge U, lived London; BBC radio producer, husband of actress/authoress Judy Cornwell; took over candidature at last minute from predecessor John Perry (sic!); active in European Movement 2000 -; remembered for campaigning with a beard, a novelty in the early 1960s; **Worcester 1964**, Hounslow, Isleworth (Greater London) 1979

PARSLEY, Michael, b 1940 ed Cambridge g s; financial dir of eng co; **Wolverhampton South East** 1979

PATTON, Brian, former Coventry MBC Labour cllr; defected to Lib Dems; Coventry South 2010

PAYNE, Charles, b 1888? electrical contractor/radio eng; active with party in Coventry until mid 1960s by when his Liberalism had assumed a decidedly Whiggish character; Coventry MBC for 25 years, Mayor 1935; remembered for his immense presence and formidable voice; he finished in fourth place behind the Communist cand; **Coventry East 1945.** Another WM personality of whom there is likely to be more of interest to be discovered.

PEARSON, Malcolm, b 1931 ed St Mary's s, Willenhall, Walsall; eng; Wolverhampton; Wolverhampton North East 1987.

PENLINGTON, Dr Napier, b 1928; ed Cambridge U, Middlesex Hospital; cons anaesthetist (ret); long associated with party in Coventry; of distinguished appearance, fine diction; remembered as affable, serious minded, energetic officer of WMRP, conducting cand adoption meetings with scrupulous regard for party procedure; regular at Party Assembly to 2014; **Staffordshire South East 1992, Coventry North West 1997, 2001** 

PHILLIPS, David Ivor, b Birmingham 1933; former RAF officer, pilot for 12 years, later founded electronics co; joined party 1973, long time sen officer of WMRP; much revered President from late 1990s to 2011; English Council; served as 'Chair of Chairs' comprising the 13 UK reg party chairmen; always sceptical about the SDP/Liberal arrangement; pioneer of regional cands media training; Euro cand 1984; not an outstanding public speaker; remembered for his restrained, serious and reasoned approach to campaigning and conciliatory attitude; prominent in moves to bring a more professional approach to regional party affairs; tenacious campaigner; lives Elmley Castle; Worcestershire South 1979, 1983, Ludlow 1987, 1992; father of the following.

PHILLIPS, Nigel, b 1956 ed Prince Henry's g s, Evesham, Leicester U; sales exec; son of the preceding; **Bromsgrove & Redditch 1979.** 

PHILPOTT, Toby, b 1969 ed Birmingham Poly; economist; later ran a management/business

development training organisation; one of youngest-ever party cands in region; national chair YLs; subsequently activist in Kent; Shepway DC; an inveterate blogger; left party c 2008; **Birmingham, Perry Barr 1992.** 

PINCHAM, Roger, CBE b 1935 ed Kingston g s; stockbroker on London Stock Exchange; lived Leominster; LPO Chair 1979-82, founder and later chair Gladstone Club from 1974, President, Lloyd George Society, Trustee of John S. Mill Institute; continues to be man of many interests; chair board of governors of St James Ind schools, 1975-2007; remembered for easy conversational style, as softly spoken, resilient, determined and dedicated with dry sense of humour; thought by some to lack the ruthless streak vital to successful politicians; by contrast nominated by *Liberator* as one of the top four most compelling platform orators in party of the later C20th; came within 579 votes of winning the traditional Tory stronghold on one occasion; his successful Conservative opponent in five elections subsequently defected to Labour; **Leominster 1970, 1974 Feb, Oct , 1979, 1983.** 

PINKERTON, M/s (Barbara) Jeanne JP, b 1946 ed Oldland sec mod s, Sandwell TC; varied career, incl newsagent, lately partner in market garden; long time Lib Dem campaigner; Bristol MBC 1986-88; lives Keynsham, nr Bristol; Kingswood (South West Region) 1992, 1997, **Stafford 2001** 

PINKETT, Mrs Jennifer (Jenny), b 1945 ed Sedgehill comp s, London, Cartrefle Coll, Wrexham; teacher of children with special needs, education administrator; hard-working, long serving WMRP Exec officer, organising countless successful WMRP Assemblies in often untried locations throughout the West Midlands; fighting local elections to date at Tamworth MBC (a notoriously barren area for the party); shouldered onerous responsibility for cand selection for WMRP at successive general elections; it is largely due to her efforts that all constituencies have been found cands in last two decades, particularly in the adverse circumstances leading to the 2015 General Election, when once again candidates were found to contest all 58 constituencies, some recruited from well outside the region; advantage has been taken of her good nature and probity, some would say gullibility, on occasion eg the Sardul Marwa case qv; remembered for her courage, energy and hard work; her irrepressible sense of fun has led to her being unkindly termed a scatterbrain at times; latterly widely respected as older stateswoman of the WMRP; Tamworth 1997, 2001, Cannock 2005, Tamworth 2010, 2015

POOLE, Christopher, b 1948 ed Liverpool U; lect in law; Coventry North West 1979.

POWIS, Alan, b 1955 ed Darlaston comp s, Walsall, Sheffield Poly, Salford U; shop manager; LD spokesperson on environmental health; sec Walsall LDA; **Walsall North 1992.** 

POWNEY, Ian George, b 1950 ed Bishop Vesey's s, Sutton Coldfield, Kent U; Sutton Coldfield

MBC 1970s, West Mids CC 1970s; worked zealously behind the scenes with Roy Lewthwaite qv to ensure a broad front at general/local elections in Birmingham; prominent as organizer at Brecon & Radnor by-election victory 1985; spent some time in West Africa; subject to sudden exits and long absences from political scene followed by dramatic re-appearances; some years later surfaced in Greater London serving on Islington MBC, still later Basingstoke MBC where he crossed the floor having been elected as an Independent; rather withdrawn in personality with little sense of humour remaining distant in company; remembered for his energy, studious and methodical approach to campaigning; **The Wrekin Feb 1974, Birmingham, Hall Green 1974 Oct,** Brigg & Cleethorpes (East Midlands Region) 1987.

PREM, Dr Dani, b 1904 Aligarh, near Delhi, of Hindu background;, India 1979; ed National U of India, King's Medical School, later at Edinburgh U; surgeon, medical practitioner; resident in UK from 1930s; Birmingham MBC (Labour) 1945-50; left Labour over immigration policies 1968; wrote *The Parliamentary Leper*, a study of deteriorating race relations in Smethwick and the general election campaign of 1964; an enigmatic character of dubious motivation in his later years; supposedly a personality of great influence in the Asian community, his defection to the Liberals resulted in very few Asian recruits to party membership, nor did it bring any detectable increase in support for the party on the part of Asian voters; after his single election fight he soon drifted away from the scene; killed in car accident, India 1979; **Coventry South East 1974 Feb**

RAY, Paul, b London 1963, ed Aston U; worked in food retail; later trained as solicitor; in practice since 1987, later partner; specialises in banking/finance law; originally SDP; lived locally since 2001; interests incl small/medium sized businesses; **Lichfield 2015** 

REDFERN, John, b 1959 ed Warwick U, U of Wales; chef; Staffordshire Moorlands DC 1991 to date, group leader, later Mayor; became activist in Stoke, fighting local elections to 2006; member of WMRP Exec from c 2000; the patient, stolid, dependable type; **Stoke-on-Trent North 1992**, **Staffordshire**, **Moorlands 2001**, **Stoke-on-Trent Central 2005**, **2010**, **Staffordshire**, **Moorlands 2015** 

REES, David (Dai) G. b 1908 ed Caterham s, U of Wales, McGill U, Canada; ind relations advisor; Mayor of Pembroke 1937-38; after making an impression in his first contest, he switched to a neighbouring constituency for the by-e where he again polled well; when a by-e occurred later in the same year in his erstwhile Oswestry constituency, the local LA were understandably unwilling to re-adopt him, understandably unenthusiastic at his 'carpet bagging' behaviour; Oswestry 1959, Ludlow by-e 1960, Cardiff North (Wales) 1964. Doubtless there is more to discover about this colourful personality

RENOLD, Robert (Rob), b Learnington 1952 ed Gordonstoun s, Birmingham U, Cranfield Inst; management cons; Leicestershire CC 1985-89; activist in East Midlands; mbr Amnesty Int, Charter 88; Leicester South 1983, Rutland & Melton 1987 (East Midlands Region), **Burton-on-Trent 1992**; Derbyshire South ( East Midlands Region) 1997.

REYNOLDS, Stewart, b 1947 ed Chesterfield s, Westminster Coll, Open U; teacher; Euro cand 1989; activist in Cannock Chase, fighting local elections up to his untimely death in 2007; Amber Valley (East Midlands Region) 1987, **Aldridge-Brownhills 1992**, **Cannock 2001**.

RICHARDS, Evan F. L., b 1927 Swansea, ed Blundell's s, Oxford U; active in student politics with ULS; strong public speaking voice: boldly expressed in public disagreement with the Lib-Con electoral arrangements at Huddersfield West and Bolton West over 1950-64; one of the ablest younger cands of the 1950 roster; party Commonwealth Affairs Comm; LPO Council; later believed to have worked in East Africa; **Birmingham, Northfield 1950**, Leyton (Greater London) 1955, Buckingham (South Central Region) 1959.

RICKETTS, Bart, b Worcester, raised Droitwich; ed Kingston U, waste manager, mbr Cha Waste Managers' Inst; cllr in London, associated with Vince Cable qv (Greater London) before returning to West Midlands; strong believer in development of the individual's potential; supports environmental and disabled persons' charities; shortly after General Election 2015 defected to the Greens; **Bromsgrove 2015** 

RIDLEY, Steven; former lawyer, later worked for Employment Services; fought Birmingham MBC elections; his early departure from active politics was regretted; **Birmingham, Northfield by-e,** 1982.

RITCHIE, Alexander Stanley, b 1892? Tooting, London; engraver; formerly Labour, joined Liberals late 1940s; during WW II worked in Royal Ordnance factory in Dorset; active with party in Southampton; said to have been the definitive Martell Plan candidate; emerged briefly as activist with Aldridge-Brownhills LA in mid 1960s; of irascible temperament; **Birmingham**, **Yardley 1950.** 

ROBERTS, Geoffrey, b 1936 ed Priory g s LSE; FE lect; **Shrewsbury 1964.** 

ROBERTS, Paul David, b 1947 ed Sevenoaks s, Aston U; ret acc/businessman; lect at Open U; long career in local government partly as council ldr; Tonbridge & Maling MBC, Kent; Euro cand 1979; persevering cand over two decades; Federal Appeals Panel; Tonbridge & Maling (South East Region) 1992, Eddisbury by-e 1999, 2001, Crewe & Nantwich 2005 (all North West Region), **Stoke-on-Trent North 2015** 

ROBERTSON-STEEL, Dr Iain, b 1954 ed Ramsey Abbey g s, Cambridgeshire, Birmingham U; GP; RAF Medical Corps until 1992; **Birmingham, Edgbaston 1992.** 

ROBINSON, Eric, b 1930, ed Hanley g s, Stoke-on-Trent, Edinburgh U, lived Bridgnorth, lect in Art; university contemporary of David Steel of whom he remained a close friend; Bridgnorth BC, Shropshire CC, later moved to Scotland to take post with Scottish Arts Council; reportedly joined Green Party there; first chairman of Transport 2000 campaign at Ludlow, remembered for boldly

taking on Enoch Powell in his heyday on his home ground; bucked the trend by raising his percentage share at Ludlow at three successive general elections, thus laying foundation for future success; returned to assist in Matthew Green's success at General Election 2001; a resolute campaigner, courageously advocating ideas years ahead of their time; remembered for his commitment and integrity of purpose; somewhat irritable, sensitive and hyper tense in personality; once described in press as 'the gay Liberal cavalier of the Salopian Folds'; vice chair West Midland Liberal Federation; Wolverhampton South West 1970, Ludlow 1974 Feb, Oct, 1979

ROLLASON, (Major) William Frederick Hubert, ed Birmingham Coll Arts & Crafts, Birmingham U; service WW II; teacher, lived Birmingham; Treasurer Oldbury & Halesowen Liberal Assn; Wolverhampton South West 1950.

ROODHOUSE, Jeremy (Jerry), b Leeds 1953 ed Harris C of E s, Rugby, Rycotewood Coll, Thame, Oxfordshire; agricultural sales eng; Warwickshire CC; Rugby DC Lib Dem gr ldr; hard-working, persistent long-serving cand; WMRP officer and rep on ELD; Euro cand 1989; Rugby & Kenilworth, 1992, 1997, Newcastle-under-Lyme 2001, Warwicks North 2005, Rugby 2010

ROSS, Colin, b 1975 Greenwich, London, ed Addey and Stanhope sec s, New Cross, London, Orpington Coll of FE, Wolverhampton U; joined party 1972p; activist in Wolverhampton, fighting local elections to date; often engaged to supervise key local by-election campaigns; disciplinarian in comm room, tempered with sense of humour, conducting polling day procedures like a military operation; agent for Paul Keetch MP qv at Hereford 2001; asst to grp ldr Walsall MBC 2014-15strong character, energetic WMRP mandarin, trade mark a genial smile; set up and maintained for a spell a highly informative, if sometimes controversial, WMRP internet web site; Euro candidate 2009; interests incl Europe, Foreign Policy; Wolverhampton South West 2005, Wolverhampton North East 2010.

ROWLEY, M/s (Alexandra) Margaret, b c1946 ed Horncastle g s, Lincs; Nottingham U, Loughborough U; librarian, learning centre man; chair, Droitwich Canal Trust 1998- playing a leading role in final years of restoring a vital canal link between the River Severn and the Worcester-Birmingham Canal; Wychavon DC; **Bromsgrove 2001, Worcestershire Mid 2005, 2010, 2015** 

ROY, George L., b Canada 1913; service WW II as air raid warden, later in army; ins agent later sales rep for agricultural machinery co; active with party until mid 1970s; rendered sterling service in various capacities as officer of former BLO; close associate of Wallace Lawler qv; rich source of reminiscences of campaigning and local party history; remembered for his party loyalty, doleful expression, tooth brush moustache; d c 2002; **Birmingham, Hall Green 1950.** 

RULE, Jonathan; son of the following; ed Friary Grange comp s, Lichfield, Oxford U, Pres Oxford

U SLD; barrister; joined party aged 15; Cheadle & Gatley MBC; pianist/comedian; his robust campaign tactics in the Hartlepool by-e 1997 incurred the wrath of Peter Mandelson, who bitterly complained about them in the press; Wigan (North West Region) by-e 1999, **Shrewsbury 2001**.

RULE, Philip, b 1936 ed Stowmarket g s; successful entrepreneur and early IT pioneer; man dir of computer co; one-time Chair of PCA; long active in Lichfield LDA; larger than life character, remembered for his encouragement of younger members, his fund of humorous political anecdotes and for his belief campaigning should be fun; disputed author of legendary party chants and slogans; (father of preceding) d 2010; **Lichfield 1974 Oct, 1979**. There may well be more to discover about this interesting character.

SADLER, Ian, b 1949; ed Adams g s, Newport, Salop; student services man; South Staffordshire DC from 1991, Wombourne PC; semi-finalist BBC TV *Mastermind* 1991; **Staffordshire South** 1992.

SAMSON, (Flt Lt.) Gerald, b c1918; one-time Reuters correspondent in Far East; RAF service WW II; made an excellent showing in a straight fight in a hitherto Tory stronghold; left active politics soon after; d Channel Islands c 2002; **Bewdley, Worcestershire 1945.** 

SEABORNE, Hadley (or Hadleigh) b 1898?; service WW I, WW II for Ministry of Supply; dir of eng co; instrumental in establishing Liberal presence post WWII in Solihull, where he lived; a Vice-Pres of WMLF in early 1960s; deplored placing of election hoardings in Warwickshire countryside during 1950 campaign; witty public speaker, with a subtle sense of humour; a figure of great dignity, widely respected; d c 1962; **Stratford-upon-Avon 1950**.

SEWARDS, Geoffrey b 1936 ed Emanuel s, Wandsworth, London, Cambridge U, Nottingham U; ret maths lect at Coventry U; activist with Coventry Lib Dems since 1973, fighting local elections to date; Euro cand 1994; Coventry South West 1992, Coventry North East 1997, 2001

SHARMA, Vinod, 1947 ed Sir Gilbert Claughton g s, Dudley, U Coll, London; of Sikh background; British Gas tech manager; Sutton LBC; **Halesowen & Stourbridge 1992.** 

SHAW, Harold, b 1920 ed St Paul's s, London U; dir of textile co; service WW II; campaigned under highly unimaginative slogan 'Better Be Shaw'; moderately successful with the Liberal Party tie he manufactured and promoted on behalf of party funds; said to have left local association saddled after general election with crippling hotel bill; **Shrewsbury 1959.** 

SHEFFIELD, Arthur A., b 1909; academic; lect, later Prof of Economics; formerly a lawyer noted for controversial libertarian views; later espoused right-wing opinions on economics in common with his wife (Dame) Barbara Lewis and Prof Michael Beesley qqv informally known as 'The Birmingham School'; d 1990; **Birmingham, Edgbaston 1945** 

SHEWARD, Roy; cand in Walsall MBC local elections, most recently 2013; **Aldridge-Brownhills 2005** 

SHIRES, Ian, b 1944 ed Pelsall sec mod s, Walsall Tech Coll, Wednesbury Commercial Coll; production supervisor; latterly self-employed financial services cons; joined party 1977; Walsall MBC from 1979; later group ldr; hard-working local activist, of great integrity, forceful speaker; shrewd and diligent operator in the minefield of Walsall politics where he helped re-introduce credibility, integrity and sanity into the Council Chamber after a long interlude under 'militant tendency' control during which Walsall was proclaimed 'a nuclear free zone'; lives Willenhall; Walsall North 1987.

SHORT, David C., b 1943 ed Gravesend g s, Kingsway Day Continuation Coll; ins cons; Free Church lay preacher; Herefordshire CC, Worcestershire CC, Leominster DC, grp ldr and one-time council ldr; Gloucestershire South (South West Region) 1974 Feb, Oct; **Leominster 1992** 

SILVER, Bernard, ed Kilburn g s, Coll for Distributive Trades; remembered for strong sense of humour, stinging one-liners and impressive moustache; a real character, he had a memorable series of contretemps with his agent, the redoubtable Olive Griffiths qv, who, he claimed 'aged me!' during the campaign; most directories erroneously label him as SDP cand at Walsall South; St Marylebone (Greater London) 1974 Feb, Oct, Bristol West (South West Region) 1979, **Walsall South 1983.** 

SIMPSON, M/s E. Ann b 1938 ed Barr's Hill g s, Coventry; teacher; Stratford-upon-Avon DC from 1990; chair Stratford-upon-Avon LDA; **Coventry North West 1992.** 

SINGH, Parmjit, b 1967 ed Joseph Chamberlain h s, Birmingham; of Sikh background; British Safety Council, London; safety man cons; Birmingham MBC elections from 1999; **Birmingham, Hall Green 2001.** 

SINGH, Arjub, Birmingham, Perry Barr 2015

SINGH, Raj Mal, b 1924; machinist/textile worker, of Sikh background; subsequently fell foul of the law and is said to have spent some time as a guest of HM prison services; **Coventry North East 1979.** 

SINHA, Dr Murli; of Muslim background; local GP with interest in environmental matters; soon defected to Labour over tuition fees, coalition plans for NHS; **Walsall South 2010.** 

SLATER, Simon, b c 1980; economist; Solihull MBC 2006 to date; made an impression with his sincerity and well-reasoned election speeches; his decision to defect to Labour in Sept 2010, due to the party joining the Conservatives in Coalition at Westminster, was deeply regretted; gained his PhD 2011; fought Ludlow 2015 for Labour; his mother Glenys remains a respected Lib Dem cllr at Solihull, Mayor 2015-16; **Meriden 2010** 

SMITH, M/s Catherine Rachel, Warley 2015

SMEDLEY, Clive, b 1945; employee relations man with comp firm; Stoke-n-Trent North 1979

SMITH, David, b 1947 ed King's s, Worcester; surveyor/auctioneer; Worcester 1974 Feb

SMITH, M/s Federica, b 1985? hails from Taunton from a Lib Dem family, ed Aberystwyth U,

Open U; works in private health ins; Taunton Deane TC; began working aged 15 for Jackie Ballard MP qv (South West Region); campaigned on record of party in coalition; seeks to redress balance of unfairness in life; **Worcester 2015** 

SMITH, Francis G. b 1924; ed King Edward's g s, Birmingham; acc; active with Old Age Pensioners' Assn; believed to have emigrated to Rhodesia after 1951; as the sole party cand in the city in 1951, and one of only three in the West Midlands, after the disaster of 1950, his modest percentage share held remarkably firm though he again forfeited his deposit; there was an interval of eight years before the party decided to contest a Birmingham constituency; **Birmingham, Small Heath 1950, 1951.** 

SMITH, J. Gordon, b 1941 ed Bury g s, Lancashire, Leeds U; civil eng; Chester MBC 1978, Sheriff 1986-87; of bluff, warm personality; **Shropshire North 1987**, City of Chester (North West Region) 1992.

SMITH, Les, b 1963 ed Maypole comp s, Birmingham, Wolverhampton Poly; economist; seemingly lacking in confidence, he made a promising showing in what later became a target seat; might well have developed into a strong cand but soon quit the scene; **Birmingham**, **Yardley 1987.** 

SMITH, Martyn, b 1946 ed Wyggeston g s, Leicestershire, Cambridge U; computer systems engineer, later community health council secretary; Newcastle-under-Lyme MBC 1972-74, West Bromwich, later Sandwell DC 1980-2007, group leader 1980-95; husband of Sadie Smith qv; WMRP officer; his membership of WM Candidates Comm during the illiberal 'Long Knives' episode 1979-80 in which PPCs suspected of retaining loyalty to former leader Jeremy Thorpe were purged, for a while clouded his reputation; influential figure in development of Lib Dem Health policies; indefatigable campaigner in party cause; remembered for his inexhaustible energy, courage, integrity; sometimes accused of high-handedness and arrogance by Sandwell MBC colleagues, several of whom defected from party group to join Labour; eloquent and persuasive speaker, though on occasion lapsing into prolixity; always very well-informed; flair for publicity; adept at producing, and pioneer in the use of, regular Focus circulars; at the time of his untimely death from cancer, he was one of the longest continuously serving party councillors in the country; his wife Sadie qv served alongside him for many years; his outstanding achievement was to carry the fight into the Labour heartland of the Black Country, hitherto barren territory for the party and to establish a strong Liberal presence; d 2007; Stoke-on-Trent South 1974 Feb, Stoke-on-Trent Central 1974 Oct; West Bromwich East 1979, 1983, 1987, 1992, 1997, West Bromwich West 2005

SMITH, Sadie, b Tonbridge, Kent, c 1945 ed Wolverhampton g h s, Wolverhampton Poly; librarian; with NHS; with her late husband Martyn qv, a long-term (until 2012) cllr Sandwell MBC; Mayor 2006-07; remembered for courage, integrity and energy and, in common with her

spouse, a barely credible capacity for hard-work; probably the first woman Lib-Dem Council group leader in WM, certainly for a Metropolitan DC; interests incl Health, equalities, regionalism; **West Bromwich West by-e 2000, 2001, 2010.** 

SOPER, Richard John, b 1913, ed Sheffield U; service WW II, engaged in preparations for D Day; town planning officer; chief planning asst Coventry Corporation 1946; dpty Chief Engineer, Hemel Hempstead Development Corporation; **Coventry South 1950.** 

SOUTHCOMBE, Michael (Mike) J., b 1962 ed Holyrood s, Chard, London U, Royal Holloway Co; environmental protection officer; campaigner against apartheid; mbr NALGO; Chard TC 1985-90; **Solihull 1992, 1997** Doncaster Central (Yorkshire Region) 2001.

SPRECKLEY, David R. A., b 1916 ed Dartmouth Naval Coll, Royal Military Coll, Sandhurst; such biographical information as exists has strong element of implausibility about it; former cavalry officer later an organiser of pre-WW II Peace Pledge U; dir of caravan building business; former Labour CCllr; joined party 1961; enthusiastic advocate of co-partnership policies; the quintessential itinerant cand, unaccountably promoted by LPO HQ for some time, dropped out of activity c 1970; in total obscurity until 2009 when reportedly involved with British Republican Party; Yarmouth 1964, Huntingdon 1966, Cambridge by-e 1967, (all East of England Region), **Newcastle-under-Lyme by-e 1969.** 

SPURLING, David, b 1940 ed Owen's s, London, Royal g s, Guildford, Bristol U; sen lect City of Birmingham Poly; later Head of Economics Gravesend g s; author of numerous text books; Southend MBC 1973, Swale BC 1994-2002; lives Sittingbourne, Kent; Meriden 1979

STAMP, Barry, b 1952 Stafford, ed West Midlands Coll of FE, St Peter's Coll, Open U; advisory teacher; Stafford MBC grp ldr; mbr party education policy grp; **Mid Staffordshire 1992, Stone 1997, Stafford 2005, 2010.** 

STANLEY, Neil, b 1952 ed King Edward's s, Stafford; NHS exec; Cannock Chase DC 1978-Staffordshire CC; Cannock 1987.

STEED, Michael, b Kent 1940; joined party locally while at school; ed Cambridge U; long-time lect in French politics, Manchester U; political scientist who became an eminent psephologist, if not inventing the discipline, greatly enhancing its standing in academic circles; appeared regularly in the media and as contributor of scholarly chapters to the Nuffield General Election studies of Butler and King from 1964; one time chair, ULS; in 1960 was refused entry by apartheid government of South Africa into Sharpeville, to deliver aid to the victims of the notorious massacre; member of LPO Council/ Executive, LPO Pres 1978-79; lived Todmorden, Lancs; very influential figure with enormous input into policy on constitutional reform etc; in 1976 designed the current system of election of the party leader; served as member of Cook-MacLennan talks which led to introduction of PR for Euro elections of 1999; associated with radical wing of the party, often at odds with Thorpe leadership; Euro cand 1979; his activities were curtailed by the onset of a debilitating neurological disorder in 1987; Todmorden TC 1987-91; author of numerous publications, pamphlets and articles in journals; from 1990s has lived in Kent; Canterbury DC 2008-; remembered as an ever-willing, committed and hard-working candidate, though his intellectual approach was hardly suited to constituency campaigning; his wife m 1970 is Margareta Holmstedt qv (Yorkshire Region); Brierley Hill by-e

STEVENS, Keith, b 1935 ed Stafford g s, King's s, Worcester, Staffordshire Coll of Agriculture; broadcaster and farmer; **Burton-on-Trent 1974 Oct, 1979**.

STEVENS, Peter R., local campaigner; **Stone 2005**

THOMAS, Haydn, ed Porth g s, London U; ret dir, nursing education; prominent at WMRP assemblies; powerful voice; somewhat officious in manner; Warwickshire CC; **Birmingham**, **Small Heath**, **1992**, **Birmingham**, **Hodge Hill 1997**.

THORNHILL, Tom, raised North Shropshire, ed at s in Whitchurch, Birmingham U, chair Lib Dem Society; made first speech in public aged seven, in protest at closing of a local public library; aged just 20, one of very youngest cands at General Election 2015; local campaigner, hospital volunteer; firmly believes in potential power of liberalism in C21st; North Shropshire 2015

TIBBETTS, Philip, b 1984 ed Earls h s, Halesowen, King Edward Coll, Stourbridge, U of St Andrews, Aarhus U, Denmark; Halesowen & Rowley Regis 2010.

WATSON, Sir Andrew Bt, b 1937 succ as 5<sup>th</sup> baronet 1941; ed Eton, Inner Temple; Lieut in Life Guards; barrister with chambers in Birmingham, later appointed Recorder 1989; remembered for his aloof personality, not a disadvantage in the constituency he fought; only fleetingly involved with party; lived Newbold-on-Stour, Warwickshire; **Sutton Coldfield 1974 Feb, Oct** 

WEBB, David, b 1935 ed Hitchin g s, London U, Cranfield Inst; comp dir formerly sen police officer, Inner City Birmingham, later sports outfitter; team manager Birmingham Bulls (American football); popular police officer in tough inner districts, noted for his work in community relations; remembered as an affable, bluff, positive personality; **Birmingham, Northfield 1983, Birmingham, Perry Barr 1987.** 

WEBB, Gavin; individualist with a propensity for falling out with local LDAs with which he had previously been active eg Stoke-on-Trent, Newcastle-under-Lyme etc; adopted PPC for Burton 2008, he proved somewhat given to maverick opinions and voicing them in the media; described himself as 'Libertarian'; amidst much adverse publicity he was later obliged to resign in 2009; subsequently left party; Stoke MBC; **Stoke-on-Trent Central 2001** 

WEDGWOOD, Major Sir John Hamilton, 2<sup>nd</sup> Bt, b 1907, ed Winchester, Cambridge U; service WW II; member of the famous pottery family; nephew of Sir Josiah Wedgwood (1872-1942 Liberal MP for Newcastle-under-Lyme from 1906, later Labour); deputy chair, Josiah Wedgwood & Sons to 1966; himself a former Labour activist, defected from the Liberals after 1950 to Conservatives becoming rabidly anti-Liberal, describing it as 'a party of liars' in a notorious local press statement at the 1964 General Election; contested Leek for the Conservatives 1959; d 1989; **Stone 1945.**

WERNICK, Joseph (Joe), b 1920, ed Wolverhampton g s, Wolverhampton & Staffs Tech; dir of family business; of Jewish background; prominent in many aspects of local public scene; appointed JP; a highly esteemed member of the community, he enjoyed much cross-party support; Wolverhampton South West 1974 Feb, Oct, 1979, Wolverhampton South East 1983.

WEST, A. C. (Tony), b 1945 ed Birmingham, Royal Coll of Nursing; nursing tutor/lect; Newport (Salop) TC; **Wrekin 1992.** 

WEST, Dr Charles, ed Birmingham U; South Shropshire DC; a well-known and respected GP in Shrewsbury area, worked in NHS management; restored Lib Dem fortunes in constituency where party had fallen back; forceful speaker; made an impact in debate on NHS at Birmingham Assembly 2011; lives Church Stretton; **Shrewsbury & Atcham 2010**.

WHEWAY, Robin, b 1949 ed Bablake s, Coventry; educational advisor; Coventry MBC; closely associated with revival of party in Coventry; a 'continuing Liberal' after 1988 merger, fighting Coventry South East under that label at General Elections of 1992,1997; **Coventry South East 1987.** 

WHARTON, Dennis, b 1963 ed Priesthope Comp s, Oxford U, Edinburgh U, Surrey U; ret head teacher; based much of his campaign on attacking record of Conservative policies in coalition; bewildered supporters and opponents alike by defecting to Conservatives in June 2015, claiming that he had held Conservative sympathies for some time; **Worcestershire West 2015** 

WHINCUP, Michael, b 1929 ed Wallasey g s, Liverpool U, Inns of Court, London; some time barrister, lect, Birmingham Coll of Advanced T'nology (now Aston U), Director of Continuing Legal Education, later Prof of Law, Keele U; author of several legal legal books eg *Medical Negligence* 1991; *Employment Law* 1995 and thought-provoking articles to political journals e g *Time and Tide;* LPO Council early 1960s; once stirred the ire of YLs for complaining of the 'excessive youth' of some of his contemporary PPCs; his wife Margaret, a strong personality and activist, was admirably supportive; remembered for his warm Mancunian voice, acid wit and incisive platform style; sometimes abrupt and impatient, he did not suffer fools gladly and was contemptuous of middle class snobbery, Conservatism and attitudes; mbr JUSTICE; incensed by local obsession with re-institution of death penalty; a great loss to the party when he gave up active politics; **Sutton Coldfield 1964, 1966.**

WHITEHOUSE, Richard F., b 1951 ed Highfield s, Wolverhampton; Hull U; schoolmaster; Wolverhampton MBC, later grp ldr/Mayor; joined party at university; mbr Amnesty; fought Derby North (East Midlands Region) 1979; persistent campaigner over 30 years; Derby North (East Midlands Region) 1979, Wolverhampton South East 1987, 1992, 1997, 2010

his zany sense of humour; defected to Conservatives; believed to have fought elections in late 1970s for that party; **Stafford & Stone 1970**.

WILLIAMS, M/s Caroline, b 1970 ed John Beddoe s, Herefordshire, Gloucestershire Coll of Art. Stafford U; private airline administrator; joined party 1997; Leominster LDA exec; lives Westhope, Herefordshire; **Leominster 2005.** 

WILLIAMS, Cecil (Gus), b 1948 St Kitts, W. Indies, ed Birmingham Poly; building surveyor, later dir of ACCAFES (community development body); first Lib Dem cand in West Mids of Anglo-Caribbean background; enjoyed high standing among his community and beyond; fought Birmingham MBC elections; later defected to Labour; remembered for his energy, enthusiasm and good-natured bonhomie; larger-than- life character, free and easy life style, the archetypal likeable rogue; target of National Front racial abuse during campaigning and shamefully, from local party 'old guard' at Nuneaton; reported in 2009 to have been appointed Hon Consul of St Kitts & Nevis to Brazilian Republic; Birmingham, Sparkbrook 1974 Oct , Nuneaton 1979, Birmingham, Perry Barr 1983.

WILLIAMS, Grant E., b 1965 Birmingham, ed Walton h s, Stafford, Wolverhampton Poly, Birmingham City U; administrator, later man cons; served on WMRP Exec in 1990s and from 2011; energetic champion of local NHS; personable manner, sense of humour; Walsall MBC 1991-95; Walsall South 1992.

WILLMOTT, Francis B., b 1894, ed Birmingham tech and commercial schools; engineer later affluent, eccentric industrialist with many local business interests; prolific writer of letters to press, notable only for their total obscurity; author of *Philosophy of Production* (1950); remembered for his irascible personality and many eccentricities; Birmingham CC (Conservative) 1950-53, fought Handsworth Ward 1959 or 1960 as Liberal; vice-chair National Union of Manufacturers; d c 1965; **Wednesbury 1959.**

WOOLLAND, Ann, b 1946; ed Grove Park g g s, Wrexham, Liverpool U; former teacher, later lab tech; Shrewsbury & Atcham MBC 1992-1997, fought local elections 2006; remembered as attractive in personality and appearance, with infectious sense of humour, petite, vivacious and energetic; **Shrewsbury & Atcham 1997.** 

WORTH, Brian, b 1938 ed Haberdashers' Aske's Hatcham s; chart acc; hon Treasurer British Council of Churches 1973-80; active with Inst of Ch Accs, UK; **Birmingham, Ladywood 1992.** 

WRIGHT, Derek, b 1924 ed Manchester g s, Keele U; teacher; activist in revival of party fortunes at Newcastle-under-Lyme from early 1960s to late 1980s; remembered for his hearty good humour and powerful voice; **Newcastle-under-Lyme 1970.** 

WRIGHT, (Col) Michael (Mike), b 1928 ed St Alban's s, Manchester U; FE lect, local director of Shelter; Warwickshire CC; amenable, approachable character, remembered for his military bearing tempered with a bluff sense of humour; **Stratford-upon-Avon 1974 Feb, Oct,** Maldon (East of England Region) 1979.

YARNELL, Raymond (Ray), b 1927 ed Warley Coll of T'nology, Bolton Tech, lect in Poly, later Open U tutor; **The Wrekin 1979, Wolverhampton North East 1983.** 

YATES, Arthur (or R)?, b 1919? former British Railways employee; in article in *Lib Dem News* in 2005, claimed to have been selected to oppose Winston Churchill in General Election at Woodford (Greater London) 1945 but was unable to return from active war service overseas in time to sign nomination papers. This story is not widely accepted. Contemporary sources confirm that the Liberal and Labour leaders had previously agreed not to oppose the candidature of the revered war time Prime Minister in his own constituency. Yates however has a strong claim to being one of the oldest surviving Liberal candidates, by date of his first contest, though not by age. His speech (according to Bob Fowler qv who was present), after the count at the election in 1950, presumably in reference to the tally of 4,692 of votes he received, comprised just five words, 'I have made my point!'; probably a Martell Plan cand; **Rowley Regis & Tipton 1950.**
