


- Acquiescing in calling the election

A Year of Brexit






Uniform Swing Projection based on average of Post-Deal Polls

Westminster Vote of Leavers





Westminster Vote of Remainers








More or Less Likely To Vote Lib Dem?














Average Policy Recognition





How Defectors Fared





Reviewing The Review

- Calling the election was a very big gamble
- The Revoke policy was ineffective rather than a vote loser
- Swinson proved no more convincing than Corbyn
- The party did fail to get its broader platform across

 but such a platform unlikely to win over Leavers
- New constituency hopes were not fulfilled but many an old flame died too. The party's electoral base has been changed by Brexit.
