PREFACE

The East Midlands has traditionally been unpromising territory for the party, returning just two Liberal Democrat MPs since World War II. Nevertheless the party has a fair record of contesting elections here compared with other regions. Compiling this Index has faced the special problem, however, of constituencies within the Humberside district established in the 1970s. Candidates in elections in the constituencies of Brigg, Grimsby and Scunthorpe up to and including the General Election of 1970 have been included in this Index. After that date these constituencies appear in the Index for the Yorkshire Region. More than thirty individual candidates have fought in more than one region, some in two or more. Surprisingly, many of these peripatetic individuals have fought constituencies in the West Midlands, equally unpromising territory for the party until recent years. The East Midlands has produced fewer outstanding party figures or characters than most other regions, though it has seen several political 'mavericks.' Many entries are thin on biographical detail. This is particularly the case with respect to SDP candidates in 1983 and 1987, about whom it is difficult to find much information. The Liberal Democrats did not nominate a candidate to oppose the retiring MP, Anna Soubry, standing as a Change candidate, at Broxtowe at the General Election of 2019.

THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing throughout the regional directories was an electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It bears the name of its principal advocate, Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who strenuously urged the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted less than two months before nomination day, many at the eleventh hour. Martell's objective was to increase the Liberal challenge to a level at which the party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected. His supporters, among them many younger party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qv (Greater London), believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate.

Most of the constituencies involved were in urban areas of Greater London, the North West, South East, Scotland and the West Midland Region. It is unlikely that the East Midlands region was affected by the Martell plan to any degree. The final national tally of candidates, a fair proportion of them of dubious Liberal pedigree, was over 450. The party lost over 300 deposits, though without contemporary records of local Liberal Associations, or regional parties, covering the period, it is now impossible to differentiate technically between a 'Martell Plan Candidate' and a candidate, albeit in an unpromising constituency, adopted following more formal procedures, well in advance of nomination day. A high percentage of the Martell Plan candidates were among those to lose their deposits of £150, then set at 12 1/2% of votes cast. Wisely provision had been made for some measure of insurance cover against this contingency with Lloyds in the City of London.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was finally achieved 25 years later under the leadership of Jeremy Thorpe at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the following election of 1979. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every successive general election. In recent times party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the party's parliamentary candidates' committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

The scale of defeat for the Liberal Party in the 1950 General Election, in which nine Liberal MPs were elected, was eclipsed by the debacle of 2015 when only eight of the previously held 57 constituencies returned a Liberal Democrat MP. No less than 340 of 631 deposits were forfeited, £170,000, at the current rate of £500, with the threshold at 5% of votes cast. No deposits had been lost by the party at the General Election of 2010. The party went on to lose a record total of 375 deposits at the General Election of 2017, totaling £187,500, again contesting virtually every constituency on the UK mainland. The party lost 136 deposits at the General Election of 2019 totaling £68,000.
