## LIBERAL/LIBERAL DEMOCRAT CANDIDATES in the GREATER LONDON REGION 1945-2019

INCLUDING SDP CANDIDATES in the GENERAL ELECTIONS of 1983 and 1987

#### PREFACE

The process of compilation of this Index for the Greater London Region, despite its sheer size, has presented no intractable problems. All constituencies within the Greater London area as constituted in 2015 are included. Before the boundaries of Greater London were changed in the reform of local government in the 1970s many of these constituencies were located, in whole or part, within the adjoining Home Counties of Essex, Hertfordshire, Kent, Middlesex and Surrey. In the mid-1970s names of constituencies lengthened to include the name of the London Borough in which they were situated. These sometimes rather cumbersome designations, frequently changed, are included in full.

At the General Election of 1950 the Home Counties in general and London Boroughs were the principal theatre of operation of the Martell Plan, explained at length under a separate heading.

A considerable number of candidates listed have fought elections in other regions. It has taken much time to track down the electoral career of many of these individuals. Some candidates listed have joined the party from other parties and their previous contests under a different banner receive mention as do the subsequent careers of a handful of former party candidates who have defected to Labour, the Conservatives etc. Information on many candidates is woefully thin. It is hoped readers will contribute details of omissions, additional information and corrections for inclusion in future editions of the directory.

After the defeat of Sir Percy Harris at Bethnal Green in 1945, London and the Home Counties remained without a Liberal MP until the historic by-election victory at Orpington in 1962. Over the period 1945-64 the Capital constituted one of the most unpromising of territories for the Liberal Party with only a token number of candidates being nominated, 1950 excepted, at successive general elections. Few by-elections were fought over the same period.

By convention, the Party did not nominate a candidate for the Speaker's constituency of Croydon North East at the General Election of 1987. By prior agreement with the Green Party, the Liberal Democrats did not nominate a candidate for the General Election of 2019 at the Dulwich, West Norwood constituency.

Both Stewart Rayment and Graem Peters have generously contributed much important information from their own researches which I have incorporated into the directory.

#### THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing throughout the regional directories was the electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It was named after Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a charismatic party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who advocated the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted only weeks before nomination day, many at the eleventh hour, Martell's objective being to increase the Liberal challenge nationally to a level at which the party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected.

Martell and his supporters, among them many younger party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qqv, believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate. The majority of the constituencies involved were in Greater London, and in urban areas of the Northwest, Southeast, Scotland and the West Midland Regions, though other regions were involved to lesser degree. Quixotically, a number of largely rural constituencies, where a Liberal candidate might have fared reasonably well, judging by results at the 1945 General Election were left uncontested. The final national tally of candidates, a fair proportion of dubious Liberal pedigree, was over 450. The party lost over 300 deposits, though without contemporary records of Liberal associations, or regional parties, covering the period, it is now impossible to differentiate technically between a 'Martell Plan Candidate' and a candidate, albeit in an unpromising constituency, adopted following more formal procedures. Nevertheless, a greater percentage of Martell Plan candidates lost their deposits of £150, then set at 12 1/2% of votes cast. Fortunately, provision had been made with Lloyds in the City of London for some measure of insurance cover against this contingency.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was eventually achieved 25 years later appropriately under Jeremy Thorpe's leadership at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the 1979 election. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every general election. In recent times party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the party's parliamentary candidates' committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

The scale of defeat in the 1950 General Election, in which only nine Liberal MPs were elected, was eclipsed by the debacle of 2015 when only eight of the previously held 57 constituencies returned a Liberal Democrat MP. No less than 340 of 631 deposits were forfeited, £170,000, at the current rate of £500, with the threshold at 5% of votes cast. No deposits had been lost by the party at the General Election of 2010. The party went on to lose 375 deposits at the General Election of 2017, totaling £187,500, again having contested virtually every constituency on the UK mainland. At the General Election of 2019, fighting on a slightly narrower front after agreement with the Welsh Nationalists and the Green party, the Liberal Democrats lost 136 deposits, amounting to £68,000.
