FOREWORD

The words Liberalism and Wales were once synonymous. Until the emergence of the Labour Party in the early part of the 20th Century, the majority of MPs Wales returned to Westminster were Liberals, and even after the Liberal Party's influence in industrial Wales waned from 1920 on, much of rural Wales has continued to retain the image and reality of a 'liberal stronghold', even at times, as now, when sadly no Welsh Liberal Democrat MPs sit at Westminster. So, as a Liberal Democrat Member of the Welsh Assembly, representing a constituency in the very heart of rural Wales, on a body that every Liberal and Liberal Democrat politician in Wales for over a century has fought so hard to create, it gives me enormous pleasure to provide this Foreword.

One of the sadnesses of electoral politics is that history tends to remember only those who are fortunate enough to win. The first-past-the-post system is a brutal, polarised, one – win or lose, with no prizes for coming second; and few remember the loser. I have been fortunate to have stood for election (and thankfully win) in a winnable constituency. Lionel's Directory reminds me and us all of the brave and selfless individuals who have stood in the Liberal cause in seats across Wales since 1945 where their chances stood at slim to non-existent. In our polarised Westminster electoral system, the voice of moderate reason tends to be drowned out in the House of Commons. Our Liberal/Lib Dem candidates across Wales have provided that voice of reason and tolerance on the ground over the decades and have, over much of the country and not just in rural Wales, received a favourable response from the electorate. At times we have held seats simultaneously in both rural Wales and central Cardiff, demonstrating that voice of reason has been widely heard. It will continue to be heard and must be heard, not least in honour of those who feature with such distinction in this Directory.

PREFACE

This Index is one of a series of fourteen covering the whole of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland, though since the number of parliamentary constituencies involved is small compared with say Greater London, or the North West Region, it occupies considerably fewer pages.

There has been particular difficulty compiling this Index, with so many individuals sharing relatively few surnames. No presumptions have been made in identifying them, even in cases of candidates of the same name fighting the same constituencies at successive general elections. For example, of the candidates named Jones, five have contested Merioneth at various times. Wales, however, has shared very few candidates with other regions which has greatly simplified the business of cross-checking. The Index lists several colourful personalities who have been widely known in fields beyond politics and there is the usual handful of eccentrics and mavericks.

The Index is far from complete with respect to biographical details. Some figures are at present identifiable only by the constituency (-ies) they contested. Further information will be most welcome. Readers are invited to point out errors and omissions. All new material will be included, after verification, in subsequent editions.

The Party has an enviable record for contesting parliamentary elections in Wales. Until 1951, Wales was considered something of a mini party stronghold, returning four Liberal MPs. There were however many constituencies in the South Wales mining areas where the Liberals had been absent from the fight from as long ago as the 1920s. Something of a revival began during the 1970s and there were usually two or three Welsh MPs on the Liberal benches at Westminster until the debacle of 2015, which left the party with just one representative in the Commons. After the General Election of 2017 the Welsh party was left totally without representation at Westminster. The victory of Jane Dodds at Brecon & Radnor in mid 2019 seemed to bode well for the future but the seat was lost in the General Election in December of the same year.

By prior electoral agreement between the Liberal Democrats, the Green Party and Plaid Cymru, the Liberal Democrats did not nominate candidates in eight Welsh constituencies in the General Election of 2019, Arfon, Caerphilly, Carmarthen East and Dinefwr, Dwyfor Meirionnydd, Llanelli, Pontypridd, Vale of Glamorgan and Ynys Mon.

THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing in virtually all the regional directories, was the electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It was first named after Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who advocated the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted less than two months before nomination day, many at the eleventh hour, Martell's objective being to increase the

Liberal challenge to a level at which the party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected.

Martell and his supporters, among them many younger party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qqv, believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate. The majority of the constituencies involved were in urban areas of Greater London, the North West, South East, Scotland and the West Midland Regions, though other regions were involved to lesser degree. Quixotically, a considerable number of largely rural constituencies went uncontested where a Liberal candidate might have fared reasonably well, judging upon results obtained at the 1945 General Election. The final national tally of candidates, a fair proportion of them of dubious Liberal pedigree, was over 450. The party lost over 300 deposits, though without contemporary records of Liberal associations, or regional parties, covering the period, it is now impossible to differentiate technically between a 'Martell Plan Candidate' and a candidate, albeit in an unpromising constituency, adopted following more formal procedures, well in advance of nomination day. An enormous percentage of the Martell Plan candidates were among those to lose their deposits of £150, then set at 12 1/2% of votes cast. Wisely provision had been made for some measure of insurance cover with Lloyds in the City of London against this contingency.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was finally achieved 25 years later under the leadership of Jeremy Thorpe at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the following election of 1979. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every successive general election. In recent times party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the party's parliamentary candidates' committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

The scale of defeat for the Liberal Party in the 1950 General Election, in which nine Liberal MPs were elected, was eclipsed by the debacle of 2015 when only eight of the previously held 57 constituencies returned a Liberal Democrat MP. No less than 340 of 631 deposits were forfeited, £170,000, at the current rate of £500, with the threshold at 5% of votes cast. No deposits had been lost by the party at the General Election of 2010. 375 deposits were lost totaling £187,500 at the General Election of 2017 when the party again contested virtually every constituency save those in Northern Ireland. The respective figures at the General Election of 2019 were 136 deposits lost amounting to £68,000.

DAVIES, Rt Hon Edward Clement, b 1884 ed Llnfyllin s, Cambridge U; highly successful barrister, KC 1926 party leader 1945-56; originally appointed as a stop-gap, pending the presumed early return to parliament of the previous leader Sir Archibald Sinclair qv (Scotland), who had lost his seat in the General Election, July 1945; in 1931, he had followed Sir John Simon's leadership of the National Liberals; resigned Liberal National Whip c1939; rejoined Sinclair Liberals c 1942; in the event, he stayed on to lead the party at three disastrous general elections in which the party in parliament was reduced to six MPs; life-long friend of Winston Churchill; his behind-the-scenes inter-party activities, in the short interval after the fall of Chamberlain in May 1940, largely contributed to Churchill's appointment as Premier in a Coalition Government a few days later; said to have been offered a viscounty at this stage which he refused; his role at this critical point in Britain's history has only of late been brought to light by historians; greatly esteemed for keeping the party alive during the bleakest period in its history after 1945; PC 1947; his leadership at the three general elections, 1950-55, even at the time was considered by many observers as uninspired and ineffective and the party's right-ward drift of the party during the period resulted in the loss of some figures on the radical wing T. L. LLOYD-GEORGE, Rt Hon Gwilym TD PC, b Criccieth 1894, later 1st Viscount Tenby; younger son of David Ll-G,(PM 1916-22, Liberal Leader 1926-31); brother of the following; MP Pembroke 1922-24, 1929-50; Parliamentary Sec Board of Trade 1931, and 1939-41, Parliamentary Sec at Ministry of Food 1941-42, Minister of Fuel and Power 1942-45; though he maintained only tenuous contact with the Liberal parliamentary party after 1939, he was not opposed by the party when he defended his seat in 1945, a glimmer of hope remaining of his possible return to the fold; was duly canvassed as possible leader in 1945 in the crisis arising from the defeat of former leader, Sir Archibald Sinclair qv (Scotland), but declined to be considered; he immediately forged closer links with the Conservatives, though he was still not opposed by a Liberal candidate in 1950, standing under the title Liberal and Conservative; in 1951 elected MP for Newcastle-upon-Tyne North 1951-57; Home Secretary and Minister for Welsh Affairs 1954-57; while at the Home Office, he declined to reprieve the murderess, Ruth Ellis, the last woman to be hanged in UK in 1955; this controversial decision nevertheless served to hasten the end of the death penalty in the UK; the pattern of his career suggests he deserved the description, 'a survivor;' rather more an administrator than a conviction politician or thinker; not mentioned with any degree of reverence by party historians; d 1967; **Pembroke 1945** see *Dictionary of Liberal Biography*

LLOYD-GEORGE, (Lady) Megan Arfon, b Criccieth 1902, daughter of David Ll-G, PM 1916-22, Liberal Leader 1916-22, 1926-31, sister of the preceding; known as Lady M. after her father's ennoblement in 1945; immersed in politics from childhood; ed privately, at Garratts Hall, Banstead and in France; was the first woman MP elected in Wales; campaigned for a Welsh Assembly and the appointment of a Secretary of State for Wales from 1940s; served on innumerable committees during World War II; when the Parliamentary party met for first time in 1945 after the General Election in July at which leader Sir Archibald Sinclair qv (Scotland), lost his seat, she was briefly considered as a possible party leader in the Commons, nearly 30 years before Margaret Thatcher was elected as the first woman to be Leader of a party at Westminster; a radical in the same vein as her father, became increasingly critical of the Clement Davies leadership, disillusioned by the party's perceived right-ward swing in late 1940s; elected party deputy leader 1949 in a bid for unity; constantly crossing swords with Lady Violet Bonham-Carter qv (Southwest Region); when she lost her seat to a Labour opponent in 1951, one perceptive observer commented 'Anglesey has clearly moved to the right'; from 1936 was romantically (and secretly) associated with Labour MP and later Noble Prize Winner and Peer, Philip Noel-Baker; powerful, eloquent speaker in Commons, at the hustings, on radio; d Criccieth 1966; she features in Lib Dem History Group booklet Mothers of Liberty pub 2012; Anglesey 1929, 1931, 1935, 1945, 1950, 1951; MP 1929-1951; left party 1955; soon joined Labour; elected MP at Carmarthen by-e 1957, 1959, 1964; MP 1957-1964 see Dictionary of Liberal Biography
