PREFACE

The compilation of this Index has been complicated by name changes of many constituencies over the years. Forty or more of the candidates listed have fought constituencies in up to five regions of the United Kingdom. Unlike industrialised regions, there have been no pockets of constituencies which the party failed to contest over the period 1945-64. Individual constituencies, however, were neglected for many years, particularly those with a history of Liberal National allegiance from the early 1930s. As the Nat-Lib-Con presence withered away after 1959, the resurgent Liberal Party began to contest these constituencies once more. There are few larger-than-life individuals among the individuals listed below, though many candidates have interesting backgrounds. Research will continue with respect to several thinly documented entries.

Following agreement with the Green Party, the Liberal Democrats did not nominate a candidate at Bury St Edmunds at the General Election of 2019. The party also stood down in the constituency of Luton South in favour of the retiring MP, who was standing as anti-Brexit candidate.

THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing throughout the regional directories was an electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It was named after Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who advocated the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted only days before nominations closed, many at the eleventh hour. Martell's objective was to increase the Liberal challenge to a level at which the Party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected. His supporters, among them enthusiastic younger Party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qqv, believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was finally achieved appropriately under the leadership of Jeremy Thorpe at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the following election of 1979. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every successive general election. In recent times Party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the Party's Parliamentary Candidates' Committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

AALDERS-DUNTHORNE, Andrew, b 1969, ed Bowthorpe h s, Norwich City Coll; primary s head teacher; Norwich MBC; **Norwich South 1997, 2001, 2005, Central Suffolk & North Ipswich 2010, South Suffolk 2017**

ABDELA, Lesley Julia, MBE, b London 1945, ed Glendower s, Queensgate, London, Queen Anne's s, Faversham, Hammersmith Coll of Art, London Coll of Printing, Chatelard, Switzerland; journalist, broadcaster; respected, leading figure in her day in campaign for women's rights and representation, one parent families etc; prominent in support for overseas aid projects in 40 different countries; in 2006 figured in top fifty 'heroes of our time' compiled by *New Statesman*; mbr Charter 88, Amnesty John Stuart Mill Inst etc; author of several books including *Women With X Appeal*; *Women Politicians in Britain Today* (1989); lives Burwash, East Sussex; **East Hertfordshire 1979**

ABEL, Deryck Robert Endsleigh, b Salisbury, 1918; ed Tottenham County s, L.S.E., London U; lost leg during WW II service which permanently undermined his health; one of the Liberal Party's great characters of the 1950s and 60s and leading post-war intellectual, long associated with *The Contemporary Review*, Editor 1960-65, succeeding the legendary G. P. Gooch; advocate of liberal concepts of freedom; witty if erudite public speaker; wrote innumerable article for press; author of *Ernest Benn, Counsel for Liberty*; early advocate of Channel Tunnel project which he termed the 'Chunnel,' as opposed to a bridge which he suggested 'might suffer from an excess of ventilation'; at an election meeting was once asked by an elderly pensioner, 'Are you in favour putting pensions up?' To which he replied unequivocally, 'The answer to your question madam is a very strong affirmative!' which brought an immediate retort, 'Does that mean yes or no?'; on a visit behind the Iron Curtain at the height of the Cold War, he congratulated the management of a state-run factory on 'your excellent workers canteen and cuisine bourgeoisie;' much-loved figure in Party; Chair of LPO Exec 1957-1959, LPO Council early 1960s; originally a staunch mbr of Free Trade Union, later sec, writing for its journal *Free Trader*; left movement c 1958 in opposition to policies of Maj Oliver Smedley qv; his cut-glass manners, rarefied diction and city gent appearance, complete with pin-striped suit, black bowler and rolled up umbrella, were not electioneering assets; author *History of British Tariffs 1923-42*; d 1965; his widow Betty was Editor of *The Contemporary Review* from 1970; **St Albans 1950**; Torquay 1951 (Devon & Cornwall Region), Worthing 1959 (Southeast Region)

ABERNETHY, William Drummond, OBE, b Epping, Essex 1913?; ed St Paul's Cathedral Choir s, Oxford U; WW II service in Sri Lanka and India; schoolmaster, later toured Britain as lect on visual aids; d 1988; **Maldon 1950**

AFTON, Richard, b Kerry, Eire 1914, of Catholic background, ed St Vincent's s, Hull, Trinity Coll, Dublin; Chair, Retarded Children's Aid Society, an official prison visitor; BBC TV producer, director, writer of many popular and prestigious programmes; first Party cand at Bury St Edmunds for 14 years; d 1985; **Bury St Edmunds by-e 1964, 1964**, Heston & Isleworth 1966 (Greater London)

AHMED, Ashuk, MBE, ed Bedfordshire, De Montfort U; local government officer 25 years; Lib Dem 20 years; lived Luton since 1980; local activist; his membership of Party was suspended at one stage for alleged anti-semitic remarks; **Luton South 2015**

AKINWALE, Chika (or Chicka?), ed Hallam U; pharmaceutical scientist; motivational writer/speaker; interests incl children's welfare; **Ipswich 2015, 2024**

AKST, Wolf Isaac, b East London E 1903, ed Shoreham g s, City of London Coll; acc; later in road haulage agricultural marketing; Eastern Counties Lib Fed; d 1980; **Peterborough 1950, 1951, Harwich 1955**

ALEXANDER, (Dr) Frances W., b Hornchurch, then in Essex 1935, ed Brentwood g co h s; trained as nurse, London Hospital, Weymouth Training Coll; practised midwifery, Oxford, later teacher of nursing studies; mbr national private nursing comm, Royal Coll of Nursing; moved to High Wycombe c1971; fought local elections for 20 years before elected 1991; later Mayor; founded Women Welcome Women Worldwide 1984, Northern Nursing Service; strongly pro-Europe, environmentalist; d 2020; **South East Essex Feb 1974**, Stepney & Poplar 1974 Oct (Greater London), **South East Essex 1979**

ALLEN, James, JP; lives local; Chair, Burling PC; charity fund raiser; interests incl NHS, care services; **Southend East & Rochford 2024**

AMOR, Nicholas, b 1950, ed Great Baddow s, Oxford U, Guildford Law s; solicitor; Brentwood DC; **Brentwood & Ongar 1983, 1987**

ANNAND, Hugh, b Welwyn Garden City 1974, ed Applecroft s, Haileybury, Loughborough U; linguist; joined Party 2001; Euro cand 2014; **North East Hertfordshire**, South Shields by-e 2013 (Northeast Region), **Welwyn Hatfield 2015, Hitchin 2017**

AQUARONE, Steffan Luke (Steff), b 1984 grew up at Blickling, ed at home, Norwich s, Warwick U; of Quaker background; digital entrepreneur, film and technology; producer of film *Tortoise in Love* (2012); also writer; cllr Norfolk CC, dept group ldr 2019-20 group ldr 2020-21; interests incl climate change; one of the most promising new figures with a media background; he regained the seat held from 2001-19 by Norman Lamb qv on a swing of 11% and with a majority of 5.5%; mbr Transport Select cttee 2024-; elected chair LD parliamentary party September 2025; **Mid Norfolk 2019, North Norfolk 2024; MP 2024-**

ARGENT, Mark, works in art/design in IT, running own business; involved in inter-faith activity; engaged in regional government and policy; strongly pro-remain; contributor to Lib Dem Voice; **Hertford & Stortford 2017, Huntingdon 2019, 2024**

ARLOTT, Leslie Thomas John; b Basingstoke 1914, ed Queen Mary's g s, Basingstoke; originally hospital records clerk, later police officer 1934-46; pre-eminent radio/TV broadcaster; began as cricket correspondent for the Liberal-leaning *News Chronicle*; fielded once as sub for Hampshire CCC; became a legend for his county cricket and Test match commentaries over 40 years from 1946. His rich Hampshire voice on the air was an instantly recognisable feature of the English summer. A man of deep humanity with a strong sympathy with the under-dog, he was bitterly opposed to apartheid in South Africa which he experienced at first hand. When asked to state his race on an immigration

form at a South African airport, he wrote 'human' against the question and was then asked by an aggressive official to explain the meaning of his answer!

He became well-known from his regular appearances on BBC Radio *Any Questions?* from the mid-1950s where he boldly stated the case for Liberalism at a time when the Party had few capable media spokespersons. A gifted, if somewhat emotional debater, he was a figure of stature in the Liberal revival at that time. A talented writer with a highly personal style, he was the author of many definitive books on cricket, incl histories, reminiscences of the game, portraits of players etc many of which have become classics. He also wrote on food, wine, the country, also publishing poetry of some merit. Of a deeply emotional character, his private life was marred by tragedy. He was not without bitter critics and enemies both inside cricket and the BBC on account of his forthright radical views. He retired to Alderney, Channel Islands and died there in 1991. **Epping 1955, 1959**

ARRAM, Joyce Muriel, b Highgate, North London 1935, of Jewish background, ed Camden g h s, North West Poly, Holborn Coll of Law; solicitor; dpty Pres Liberal Democrat Lawyers Assn; bitterly opposed to cuts in Legal Aid provision proposed by government; fought MBC elections in Finchley, Barnet areas; warm and likeable personality, popular and respected in Party circles; attempted to strengthen role in the Party of the Candidates Assn; d 2018; **South East Essex 1966**, Ruislip-Northwood 1970, 1974 Feb, Oct (Greater London)

ATKINS, Richard S., Ipswich MBC, Euro cand; defected to Conservatives; **Ipswich 2005**

AUSTEN, Beryl, b 1930 ed sec s, tech, Open U; ret self-employed hotelier; sec of hospice; **Epping Forest 1992**

AUVRAY, Raymond Michael, b 1948, ed Bidford g s, Reading U, Northeast London Poly; principal careers officer; Essex CC; **Basildon 1979, 1987**

BAKER, David, b 1935, ed Bury g s, Manchester U; int systems cons; Essex CC; **Castle Point 1997**

BANKS, Desmond Anderson Harvie, later Lord B. of Kenton, b Ascot 1918, ed U Coll s; life ins broker, pensions cons; war service; joined Party at school; co-founder 1952 with Peter Grafton qv of Radical Reform Group, to counter perceived rightward drift of Party, remaining a member until its demise in early 1960s; author many pamphlets and policy papers; speech writer to Jo Grimond; strongly committed supporter of European Union, Chair, Liberal Euro action Group, Chair European Movement 1986-94; Chair LPO Exec 1961-63, Pres 1968-69, CBE 1972, Life Peer 1975, deputy Chief

Whip in Lords 1975-83; greatly respected throughout the party; of a kindly personality, gentle and reasoning in approach, an effective speaker on TV and radio; d 1997; m Barbara Wells OBE, a stalwart of WLF; Harrow East 1950 (Greater London), St Ives 1955 (Devon & Cornwall Region), **South West Hertfordshire 1959** see *Dictionary of Liberal Biography*

BANTON, Alan J., b 1948, ed sec s; with blood transfusion service; Basildon DC; **Thurrock 1992**

BARNETT, Jack Harris, b 1926, of Jewish background, ed Londonderry, Central Foundation s; journalist; gen sec British Section, World Jewish Congress; strong public speaking voice; Gravesend 1964, 1966 (Southeast Region), **Southend West 1970**

BARON, Christina A. M., b 1950, ed St Leonard's s, St Andrews, City U, London; research student, part-time university tutor; m Alan Butt-Philip qv (Southwest Region); lives Wells; **Hemel Hempstead 1974 Feb, Oct**

BEAVAN, David, b 1951, ed Stowe s, Essex U; farmer, boat restorer, former journalist; campaigned to have second homes tax loophole closed; the matter was taken up by the Lib Dem Peer, Lord Shipley, in House of Lords; originally a Liberal he defected to fight Waveney for SDP in 1987 (see SDP section), subsequently rejoined Lib Dems; clrr East Suffolk DC 2019- grp ldr, Chair, East Suffolk LDA, he was expelled from the party in 2024 for publicly calling for support for a Green cand; **Hitchin 1974 Feb, South Suffolk 2019**

BECKETT, Mike, cllr Brightlingsea TC; his wife Caroline is the local vicar; organised food banks in several centres incl Colchester; community worker, former CAB manager, nursing assist; believes in devolving power from the top; **Harwich & North Essex 2019**

BEDFORD, Sara, joined Party 1980s; Chair, NYLDs; LPO Exec, Conference comm; Council ldr Three Rivers DC, Hertfordshire CC, Abbots Langley TC; served on review panel of 2019 Euro and Parliamentary elections; many interests incl education; **Welwyn Hatfield 2005**

BELFITT, Nicholas, raised/ed Isle of Wight, Surrey U, where he campaigned against university job cutting; sports teacher; Isle of Wight 2017 (South Central Region), **Broxbourne 2024**

BELLARD, Francis (Frank), b 1946, ed St Margaret's b h s, Liverpool, Spion Kop, Anfield, Northeast London Poly, Garnett Coll; worked with fire brigade, then long career in prison service; systems eng; Basildon DC, Essex CC; cands team ldr, Eastern Region 1997; **Billericay 1992, 2001**

BENJAMIN, Malvyn A., b 1937, ed Dulwich Coll prep s, St Paul's s, King's Coll, London U; solicitor; of Jewish background; active in Jewish communal organisations; by the time of Luton by-election, the Liberal upsurge triggered by the Orpington victory in February 1962, had spent itself; at Barrow a decade later he was the first Party cand locally for 24 years, polling 19.6%; wrote a moving and graphic account of his battle with life-threatening amyloidosis, and subsequent treatment, for British Medical Journal Nov 2011; **Luton by-e 1963**, Barrow-in-Furness 1974 Feb, Oct (Northwest Region)

BENNETT, Air Vice-Marshal Donald Clifford Tyndall, b Queensland, Australia 1910, ed Brisbane g s., RAAF 1930, later RAF; broke several distance flying records; distinguished war record; known as 'Pathfinder' Bennett; his innovations and strategies 1942-45 greatly increased efficiency of Allied bombing campaign against Nazi Germany; described as 'most distinguished technical airman of his generation'; youngest-ever Air Vice-Marshal; highly respected but remembered by his crews and staff as aloof and personally difficult; at Middlesbrough the incumbent Liberal MP Harcourt (Crinks) Johnstone died early in 1945, Bennett being returned unopposed in the by-e but lost the seat in the General Election shortly after in a straight fight with Labour by 2,613 votes; post-war appointed dir of British South American Airways; later became associated with far right fringe, National Independence Party etc; anti-Common Market; autobiography *Pathfinder* (Muller, 1959); d 1986; Middlesbrough West by-e 1945, 1945 (MP for only 73 days - Northeast Region), Croydon North by-e 1948 (Greater London), **Norwich North 1950**

BENNETT, Nigel b Doncaster 1966, ed Hallcross comp s, Doncaster, Leicester U; teacher; Sudbury TC, Mayor 2003, 2007; Baberg DC group ldr; **South Suffolk 2010**

BENSILUM, Matthew, lives locally; Tendring DC; interests incl cost of living, housing, NHS; **Clacton 2024**
