FOREWORD

The words Liberalism and Wales were once synonymous. Until the emergence of the Labour Party in the early part of the 20th Century, the majority of MPs Wales returned to Westminster were Liberals, and even after the Liberal Party's influence in industrial Wales waned from 1920 on, much of rural Wales has continued to retain the image and reality of a 'liberal stronghold', even at times, when sadly no Welsh Liberal Democrat MPs sat at Westminster. So, as a Liberal Democrat Member of the Welsh Assembly, representing a constituency in the very heart of rural Wales, on a body that every Liberal and Liberal Democrat politician in Wales for over a century has fought so hard to create, it gives me enormous pleasure to provide this Foreword.

One of the sadnesses of electoral politics is that history tends to remember only those who are fortunate enough to win. The first-past-the-post system is a brutal, polarised, one – win or lose, with no prizes for coming second; and few remember the loser. I have been fortunate to have stood for election (and thankfully win) in a winnable constituency. Lionel's Directory reminds me and us all of the brave and selfless individuals who have stood in the Liberal cause in seats across Wales since 1945 where their chances stood at slim to non-existent. In our polarised Westminster electoral system, the voice of moderate reason tends to be drowned out in the House of Commons. Our Liberal/Lib Dem candidates across Wales have provided that voice of reason and tolerance on the ground over the decades and have, over much of the country and not just in rural Wales, received a favourable response from the electorate. At times we have held seats simultaneously in both rural Wales and central Cardiff, demonstrating that voice of reason has been widely heard. It will continue to be heard and must be heard, not least in honour of those who feature with such distinction in this Directory.

PREFACE

This Index is one of a series of fourteen covering the whole of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland, though since the number of parliamentary constituencies involved is small compared with say Greater London, or the North West Region, it occupies considerably fewer pages.

There has been particular difficulty compiling this Index, with so many individuals sharing relatively few surnames. No presumptions have been made in identifying them, even in cases of candidates of the same name fighting the same constituencies at successive general elections. For example, of the candidates named Jones, five have contested Merioneth at various times. Wales, however, has shared very few candidates with other regions which has greatly simplified the business of cross-checking. The Index lists several colourful personalities who have been widely known in fields beyond politics and there is the usual handful of eccentrics and mavericks.

The Index is far from complete, up-to-date or error free with respect to biographical details. Some individuals are at present identifiable only by the constituency (-ies) they contested. Further information will be most welcome. Readers are invited to point out errors and omissions. All new material will be included, after verification, in subsequent editions.

The Party has an enviable record for contesting parliamentary elections in Wales. Until 1951, Wales was considered something of a mini party stronghold, returning four Liberal MPs. There were however many constituencies in the South Wales mining areas where the Liberals had been absent from the fight from as long ago as the 1920s. Something of a revival began during the 1970s and there were usually two or three Welsh MPs on the Liberal benches at Westminster until the debacle of 2015, which left the party with just one representative in the Commons. After the General Election of 2017 the Welsh Liberal Democrats were left totally without representation at Westminster. The victory of Jane Dodds at Brecon & Radnor in mid 2019 seemed to bode well for the future but the seat was lost in the General Election in December of the same year.

By prior electoral agreement between the Liberal Democrats, the Green Party and Plaid Cymru, the Liberal Democrats did not nominate candidates in eight Welsh constituencies in the General Election of 2019, Arfon, Caerphilly, Carmarthen East and Dinefwr, Dwyfor Meirionnydd, Llanelli, Pontypridd, Vale of Glamorgan and Ynys Môn. This arrangement was not repeated at the General Election of July 2024, when the Liberal Democrats contested all 32 of the redrawn constituencies in the Principality. David Chadwick's victory at Brecon, Radnor & Cwm Tawe secured a voice for the party at Westminster after an interval of five years.

THE MARTELL PLAN

The Martell Plan, mentioned in passing throughout the regional directories was an electoral strategy adopted by the Liberal Party for the General Election of 1950. It was named after Edward Martell qv (Greater London), a party 'grandee' of the immediate post-war years who advocated the nomination of over 150 additional candidates in constituencies which had little or no Liberal organization nor history of Liberal activity in recent years. Most were adopted only days before nominations closed, many at the eleventh hour. Martell's objective was to increase the Liberal challenge to a level at which the Party would be enabled to form a government, presuming enough MPs were elected. His supporters, among them enthusiastic younger Party members including Jeremy Thorpe, Isaac Hyam qqv, believed that a steadily growing number of adoptions being announced in the media would create a momentum of its own in the minds of the electorate.

The goal of fighting every mainland constituency in the UK was finally achieved appropriately under the leadership of Jeremy Thorpe at the General Election of October 1974. The broad front was reduced, marginally, at the following election of 1979. In both 1983 and 1987 the Liberals and their allies, the SDP, each contested roughly 50% of the UK parliamentary constituencies, avoiding contests against each other save in a handful of cases. Since 1992 the Liberal Democrats have contested every constituency in mainland UK, save for that held by The Speaker and a handful of other instances, at every successive general election. In recent times Party nominees who are nominated at the last minute in unpromising constituencies, simply to show the flag, have come to be termed 'paper candidates.' Virtually every candidate at recent general elections, however, has been approved by the Party's Parliamentary Candidates' Committee and adopted according to formal procedure.

BOWEN, (Capt) Evan Roderick, b Cardigan 1913, ed Cardigan Co s, Aberystwyth, Cambridge U; service WW II; highly successful barrister, later Recorder of Merthyr Tydfil, Carmarthen etc; with his interests focused on his legal career, he was never as prominent a figure in the Parliamentary Party or the Commons as he might have been, though he could be a witty speaker; generally to the right of the Party, supporting the Conservative government during Suez episode; was a favoured alternative to succeed Clement Davies as Liberal Leader in 1956; this is said to have soured his relations with Jo Grimond qv (Scotland) who was elected instead; amid controversy he accepted in 1965 the post of Deputy Speaker of Commons, offered by Premier Harold Wilson, thus increasing the Labour majority to five; this was done without Grimond's knowledge or approval; local resentment at this probably accounted for his narrow defeat by 523 votes after 21 years in 1966; he played no part in politics thereafter; National Insurance Commissioner for Wales 1967-1986; life-long commitment to Wales and Welsh culture; d 2001 in relative obscurity leaving a considerable fortune, at Llandaff; **Cardiganshire 1945, 1950, 1951, 1955, 1959, 1964, 1966; MP 1945-66**

BRANSBURY- WILLIAMS, Lt-Col Morgan Edward, of an old local family; ed RMA Sandhurst; career army officer; served Egypt WWII later in Embassies, War Office, Yugoslavia etc; moved to Farnham where he took up farming; Farnham TC, Surrey CC; his wife Zora was an activist and cllr; his constituency had been left unfought since 1929; he garnered surprisingly over 10,000 votes; **Llandaff & Barry 1945**

BRAY, Steve, b Cardiff 1969, later lived Port Talbot; after service in HM Army became rare coin dealer; extravert character with flair for self-publicity; long term fervent Stop Brexit protester outside Houses of Parliament; made hundreds of appearances at College Green in 2018-19 becoming a familiar figure in the media in his colourful attire, interrupting interview with MPs, Ministers etc; not considered a serious candidate by many though he marginally raised the Lib Dem vote in his constituency; vigorously continued his anti-Brexit campaign but was subsequently banned from every location from Parliament to Whitehall; appears to have severed his connection with Lib Dems after 2019; **Cynon Valley 2019**

BRERETON, W. (Bill) D., b 1955? ret dpty Chief Constable North Wales Police; cand for Welsh Assembly 2011; latterly working in construction ind, management cons; holds appointments with health authorities; unhappy about elected police commissioners; Pres, North Wales Motorcycle Alliance; **Delyn 2010**

BRIGHTON, Paul J., b 1942, ed Exeter U, Sussex U; teacher; active with NAS; took a 31-year sabbatical between his 3rd and 4th contests; **Flint West 1974 Feb, Oct, Alyn & Deeside 2005, 2010**

BRITTON, Robert A., ed Monkton House s, Cardiff; Inns of Court School of Law; barrister; **Alyn & Deeside 1992**

LLOYD-GEORGE, (Lady) Megan Arfon, CH, b Criccieth 1902, daughter of David LI-G, (PM 1916-22, Liberal Leader 1916-22, 1926-31), known as Lady M. after her father's ennoblement in 1945; immersed in politics from childhood; ed privately, at Garratts Hall, Banstead and in France; was the first woman MP elected in Wales; campaigned for a Welsh Assembly and the appointment of a Secretary of State for Wales from 1940s; served on innumerable committees during World War II; when the Parliamentary Party met for first time in 1945 after the General Election in July at which leader Sir Archibald Sinclair qv (Scotland), lost his seat, she was briefly considered as a possible Liberal Leader in the Commons, nearly 30 years before Margaret Thatcher was elected as the first woman to be a Party Leader at Westminster; a radical in the same vein as her father, became

increasingly critical of the Clement Davies leadership, disillusioned by the Party's perceived rightward swing in late 1940s; elected Party Deputy Leader 1949 in a bid for unity; constantly crossing swords with Lady Violet Bonham-Carter qv (Southwest Region); when she lost her seat to a Labour opponent in 1951, one perceptive observer commented 'Anglesey has clearly moved to the right'; from 1936 was romantically (and secretly) associated with Labour MP and later Noble Prize Winner and Peer, Philip Noel-Baker; powerful, eloquent speaker in Commons, at the hustings, on radio; left Party 1955; soon joined Labour; elected Labour MP at Carmarthen by-e 1957; MP 1957-1966; CH 1966; d Criccieth 1966; (sister of the preceding); she features in Lib Dem History Group booklet *Mothers of Liberty* (2012); **Anglesey** (now known as Ynys Môn) 1929, 1931, 1935, **1945, 1950, 1951; MP 1929-1951**; see *Dictionary of Liberal Biography*

LLOYD-WILLIAMS, Sara, grew up in Snowdonia ed Bangor U, Aberystwyth U, archivist; Chair, LDYs Wales; **Carmarthen East & Dinefwr 2015**

LOCKYER, Sarah, long service in mental/elderly health social care; calls for more finance, resources for NHS; **Newport West 2017**

LORT-PHILLIPS, (Lt Col) Patrick H., b 1910/11, ed Eton, Sandhurst Military Acad; farmer, author, journalist, twice recipient of DSO during service WW II; Joint Treasurer LPO; member of CND; in a motion before the Party Assembly 1960 which was overwhelmingly defeated, he called for the end of the British nuclear deterrent as an act of faith in UNO; in the by-election at Ebbw Vale some months later, though favourably disposed to his candidature in general terms, the Party Leader, Jo Grimond, qv (Scotland) declined to offer L-Phillips more than token support; he was the first Liberal to brave this rock-solid Labour stronghold since 1929, (fief of legendary Labour firebrand, Aneurin Bevan), just failing to save his deposit; later selected cand for Pembroke, but resigned after disagreement over policy on nuclear weapons, advocating Britain should disarm unilaterally; subsequently left Party; d 1979; Gloucester by-e 1957, 1959 (Southwest Region), **Ebbw Vale by-e 1960**
